Without that information, your picture is useless because we won't know who sent it in.

his was not your typical May for fishing. Charlotte Harbor continued to be a tough date. Besides giving up only a handful of quality fish, she

was downright nasty and temperamental at times. Talk about getting kicked in the posterior when you're down scrounging for a hook-up (sharks excluded), or getting home safely. That's not based solely on my personal experience, but that of others fishing this area for a very long time.

Offshore wasn't much better this month either. Lots of speculation as to why, but no one knows for sure. Some say the variable winds and fluctuating water temperatures, while others blame the lack of bait migration or toxic algae. Based on long term water quality monitoring results in the Harbor, nutrient loadings that help produce algae growth are down about 20% compared to the 2006 -2008 timeframe, when fishing was better, so it's puzzling for sure. All we can do is hope it improves soon, or I'll need more than one night a week at the Tiki Hut.

Cobia were one of those elusive species this month. Only 3 were entered by the male anglers, and none by the lady anglers. Over twice that number were submitted last month, so it's my fault for picking May as cobia month. Sorry about that. I sure hope June is better to us for tarpon. Congratulations to May's cobia winners:

- **John Stockinger** 2nd place with a \$25 gift certificate to Fishin' Frank's for a fork length of 27.5".
- Mike Gilger 3rd place with a \$15 gift certificate to Rio Villa Bait & Tackle for a fork length of 17.0"

If you did catch a cobia in May and didn't submit it, you may have missed out on a great prize. So make sure that if you do catch a fish of the month or any fish for that matter, attach a picture to an email identifying your full name, length and type of fish, date caught and a note if you used a paid guide, and send it to fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org. It's that easy, and it enters your catch into all of the Club's programs and contests as long as you satisfy each of

the respective revised rules for these events. The revised rules can be found on the Club's great website at pgifishingclub.org.

While you're on the computer, why not also post your pictures on the Cub's Facebook page so we can all get a real time idea of what's biting.

Our June FOM contest is for tarpon this year, not for snook. Snook will be the FOM in September when the season for them is expected to reopen. You get one point for each tarpon "landed" that is under 5 feet long, and 3 points for any tarpon "landed" that is estimated to be 5 feet or longer. We don't expect you to measure these fish with a ruler or measuring stick. Do the best you can to estimate the total length using a reference point of known length like your leader length or rod length, and make sure you get a picture of you with the tarpon (keep the tarpon in the water to minimize injury to you and the fish). You or your fishing partner need to touch the leader for the tarpon to be considered as having been "landed". It really helps to go after these fish with a partner or two, and to fish with heavy enough gear so as not to overly stress the fish. But remember, you must hook and fight the fish all the way to the leader touch for it to count in this contest (i.e., no help from others except with the "landing" part). Also, fish caught with a paid guide don't count for this contest. Your tarpon FOM entries are due no later than July 1.

All current contest results are nicely summarized later in this Newsletter, and awards for May will be handed out at our next general meeting on June 10. **Dick Doster** is going to receive his Grand Master Angler shirt for satisfying all the eligible species and associated points requirements in the Ladder of Angling Achievement Rules, and he's already working on his GMA Star. **Rich Brennan** will be getting his GMA Star by having amassed 2000 points this year. Congratulations to you both!

One last thing, don't forget to sign up for the July 28 fishing outing (rain date is July 29). We'll be awarding \$25 gift certificates for the longest shark, sting-




Everyone likes to think they're not forgotten. No matter how independent a person is, everyone likes to be remembered. And that's what I do.


