FISHING REPORT

Vice President Jim Crawley

June's Fish of the month is flounder. We have two varieties, the Southern and Gulf Flounders, with the Gulf being the more common in our area. These tasty treats can be found in relatively shallow areas on soft or sandy bottom and near bars, rubble, edges of channels, and holes in grass beds. Shrimp, jigs, and paddle tails are your best bait bets.

This is the time of year the best fishing is going to be down in Pine Island Sound and near the passes. Snook will be down near the beaches and inter-coastal for spawning. You'll also be able to find Spanish mackerel, pompano, and snappers.

Of course this is the prime time for TARPON! They should be stacked up in Boca Grande pass and begin to move into the harbor in the deeper holes. They are primarily feeding on crabs, but the old standby, ladyfish also work. Following the tarpon in are large hammerheads and bull sharks.

With so many fishermen trying to hook up on tarpon and snook, it will be a good time to hunt for redfish and trout. Look up around the bushes behind Cayo Costa, Bull Bay, and Turtle Bay when the tide is half high and better. Remember, the reds have been real spooky, so you need to shut down your outboards early and sneak in on them.

For the offshore fishermen, red snapper season opens in federal waters June 1 thru 9. Wow, a whole 9 days! We won't mention the state open season since there aren't any here in our state waters. Other snappers are open though and should be biting from the pass out to 20 plus miles. Look for the bigger amberjack on wrecks that are out 30 to 35 miles. Red Grouper reports that they are 40 to 45 miles out the pass. It's a long run for only 2 fish per person, but they are out there waiting for us to visit.

There is no doubt fishing has been tough this year. El Nino has changed the times migrating species have come into the harbor. It may have also effected the fishing. But fishing has not been what it should have been. We've been discussing other factors that could impact our fishing, such as commercial shrimping, damage to sea grass from high speed running behind the bars, commercial mullet fishing, and too many tournaments. I brought these concerns to the Marine Advisory Board. They recommended I talk to FWC and to FL Dept. of Environmental Protection, who happened to have a representative at the meeting. They also recommended we work with the Fisheries Forum. I will be giving an update from talking with all these groups at our club meeting in June.



I thought I would look forward a couple months so everyone will know what our upcoming Fish of the Month species will be.

June Fish of the Month: Flounder

Florida State Record is 20 lb. 9oz.

Bag Limit is 10 per day per person

Fishing Notes: Found on sandy bottoms, aggressive feeder which will chase a passing bait or lure. Generally caught within a few feet of bottom. Live shrimp and small bait fish make excellent bait as do jigs and spoons.

July Fish of the Month: Shark

Excellent sense of smell. In summer they are easily attracted by chumming the water. They will scavenge dead baits but prefer live. This time of year can they be found throughout the harbor but best success is normally middle to southern half of the harbor. Steel leaders highly recommended.



I know many of you caught the May's Fish of the Month Cobia! Here is one of my favorite ways to prepare Cobia. I have been asked for this recipe many times by people who have enjoyed it prepared at my house.

Marinated and Grilled Cobia

3 lbs Cobia

1/3 cup Olive Oil

1/3 cup Fresh Squeezed Lemon Juice

- 1 1/2 teaspoons dry mustard
- 1 clove Garlic, Minced
- 1 teaspoon Sea Salt
- 1/4 teaspoon Freshly Ground Pepper

Cut fillets into serving size pieces and place in a bowl. Combine olive oil and lemon juice. Add all remaining spices to oil and lemon juice and mix. Pour mixture over the fish steaks. Marinate for 5 minutes. Remove from marinade and barbecue for about 8 minutes. (Keep checking, do not overcook!) Turn as necessary, basting several times with marinade. Serve hot off the grill.

PGI MARINE WATCH

If you can volunteer no more then 2-hours each month and have a boat, then you may want to consider becoming a member of one of the most unique community volunteer groups in Southwest Florida. Each day of the month PGI NMW members rise up in the night and early morning hours, launch their personal boats and go "On Patrol" to observe and report all suspicious boating or land activity to the Punta Gorda Police Department night dispatcher.

We prefer all members have a boat that they can use for their monthly patrol. However, you do not have to own a boat to become a member. You can act as "crew" during any other members patrol or, in the event of inclement weather or other unsafe "on-the-water" conditions, perform your 2-hour patrol at pre-designated land locations in your vehicle.

The preferred boat size is 17 to 23 feet, with either a T-top or bow rail to display "Patrol Boat" signage that identifies your vessel as a PGI Neighborhood Marine Watch Patrol Boat.

General Snapper Regulations:

- · Within state waters of the Atlantic and Gulf, the snapper aggregate bag limit is 10 fish per harvester unless the species rule specifies that it is not included in the aggregate. This means that a harvester can retain a total of 10 snappers in any combination of species. Exceptions are noted below
- If no season information is included, the species is open year-round.

Grouper

Atlantic Grouper General Regulations:

- Atlantic grouper regulations apply to all state waters of the Atlantic and all state waters off Monroe County (Gulf and Atlantic sides).
- · Atlantic grouper aggregate bag limit is 3 fish, which means that no harvester shall retain more than 3 Atlantic groupers in any combination of species.

Gulf Grouper General Regulations:

- · Gulf grouper regulations apply to all state waters of the Gulf except off Monroe County (where Atlantic rules apply).
- Gulf grouper aggregate bag limit is 4 fish which means that no harvester can retain more than 4 Gulf grouper in any combination of species.
- Zero bag limit for captain and crew of for-hire vessels applies to gag, black, and red grouper only.

Season Information:

• If no season information is provided, the species is open vear-round.

- . Unregulated in all other areas.

Pelagics



Minimum Size Limits:

- Sailfish 63";
- Blue Marlin 99"
- White Marlin 66"; Roundscale Spearfish 66"

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 1 per harvester per day aggregate bag limit

Remarks

- Measured tip of lower jaw to fork. All landed fish must be reported to NOAA within 24 hours 800-894-5528 or hmspermits.noaa.gov.
- . HMS permit required in federal waters.



Minimum Size Limits:

· 2 per harvester per day

Swordfish

Minimum Size Limits:

• 47" lower jaw fork length with head attached or 25" cleithrum to keel length if head removed

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 1 per harvester per day, not to exceed a maximum of 4 per recreational (not for-hire) vessel or 15 per for-hire vessel per day

Remarks

 All landed fish must be reported to NOAA within 24 hours 800-894-5528. HMS permit required in federal waters. Zero daily bag and possession limit for captain and crew of for-hire vessels.



Cobia (Ling)

Minimum Size Limits:

· 33" fork length

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

 1 per harvester per day, not to exceed 6 per vessel per day



Mackerel, King

Minimum Size Limits:

• 24" fork length

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 2 per harvester per day

Remarks

. Bag limit reduced to 1 in some state waters if



federal waters are closed to recreational harvest.

Dolphinfish

Minimum Size Limits:

- Atlantic 20" fork length
- · Gulf None

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 10 per harvester per day, not to exceed 60 per vessel per day. Vessel limit does not apply to for-hire vessels.

Crustaceans and Mollusks



Bay Scallops

Season:

• Open June 25-Sept. 24, 2016

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 2 gallons whole or 1 pint meat per harvester per day; no more than 10 gallons whole, or ½ gallon meat per vessel anytime

Remarks

 Harvest allowed only in state waters of the Gulf of Mexico from the Pasco-Hernando county line, to the west bank of the Mexico Beach Canal in Bay County. It is illegal to harvest, possess and land bay scallops on waters outside open harvest area.



Closed Season:

 April & May closed in Nassau, Duval, St. Johns, Putnam, Flagler & Clay counties

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

 5 gallons heads on per harvester or vessel per day, whichever is less

Remarks

 Visit: MyFWC.com/Fishing and select "Saltwater", "Regulations" and "Shrimp" for additional regulations specific to Dade, Nassau and Duval



Minimum Size Limit:

 Carapace must be greater than 3" measured in the water

Seasons:

- Sport Season Open July 27-28, 2016
- Regular Season Closes on March 31, 2016
 Reopens Aug. 6, 2016

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

- Sport Season: 6 per harvester per day in Monroe County and Biscayne National Park, 12 per day in all other harvest areas.
- Regular Season: 6 per harvester in all areas

Remarks

 Recreational trapping prohibited. Spiny lobster permit required when license required. Harvest of egg-bearing females prohibited.



Minimum Size Limits:

• 1" thick across hinge

Clams (Hard)

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

 One 5 gal. bucket per harvester or 2 per vessel (whole in shell)

Remarks

- Illegal to harvest from closed areas.
- Go to www.FloridaAquaculture.com for allowable harvesting areas.
- May not harvest half hour after official sunset until half hour before official sunrise.



Minimum Size Limits:

2¾" claw

Closed Season:

May 16-Oct. 14

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 1 gal. claws per harvester or 2 gal. per vessel, whichever is less

Remarks

 5 traps maximum. Visit MyFWC.com for statewide trap construction requirements and specific requirements that apply in Miami-Dade, Monroe and Collier. Illegal to possess whole crab. Harvest of egg-bearing crabs prohibited.



Closed Season:

 Regional trap closures apply. See MyFWC.com for 2016 trap closure dates and locations.

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 10 gallons whole per harvester per day

Remarks

• 5 traps maximum. Trap requirements apply. Harvest of egg-bearing crabs prohibited.



Oysters

Minimum Size Limit:

• 3"

Closed Season:

- June, July, Aug. in Dixie, Wakulla, Levy counties.
- July, Aug., Sept. in all other areas except Apalachicola Bay which has open areas year-round.

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

 2 bags per harvester or vessel except Apalachicola Bay

Remarks

- Aplachicola Bay: special bag limits and other harvest restrictions apply. See MyFWC.com for detailed information.
- Apalachicola Bay has summer & winter seasons/ areas.
- Harvest from approved shellfish areas during daylight hours only.
- Go to FloridaAquaculture.com to determine the Open or Closed status of shellfish harvesting areas.
- May not harvest half hour after official sunset until half hour before official sunrise.
- 1 Bag = 60 lbs. or two 5 gal. buckets (whole in shell)
- Harvest prohibited in any harvest area that is in the Closed status as determined by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

Sharks

Daily Recreational Bag Limit:

• 1 per harvester or 2 per vessel per day, whichever is less.


Domarks

- The retainable sharks are managed as a group for bag limit purposes. In other words, you can only harvest one shark per day and the shark that you harvest must be one of the retainable species.
- . Hook-and-line gear only.
- See list of prohibited species below.

Prohibited Species

It is unlawful to harvest, possess, land, purchase, sell or exchange the following species:

Goliath Grouper (Jewfish), Nassau Grouper, Sawfish, Atlantic Angel Shark, Bigeye Shark, Bigeye Sixgill Shark, Bigeye Fixesher Shark, Bigeye Fixesher Shark, Bigeye Shark, Caribbean Reef Shark, Caribbean Sharpnose Shark, Dusky Shark, Galapagos Shark, Lemon Shark, Longfin Mako Shark, Narrowtooth Shark, Night Shark, Silky Shark, Sand Tiger Shark, Sevengill Shark, Sixgill Shark, Sixgill Shark, Spiny Dogfish, Whale Shark, White Shark, Tiger Shark, Great Hammerhead Shark, Scalloped and Smooth Hammerhead Shark, Manta Ray, Devil Ray, Spotted Eagle Ray, Longbill Spearfish, Mediterranean Spearfish, Sturgeon, Queen Conch, Calico Scallop, Stony, Hard and Fire Corals, Sea Fans, Bahama Starfish, and Longspine Urchin. Harvest of live rock in state waters is prohibited. Puffer fish harvest is prohibited in Volusia, Brevard, Indian River, St. Lucie and Martin counties.






