# **Fishing Events**

#### Fish Of the Month Grouper

Our November FOM will continue to be grouper, even though the season for red grouper is closed in federal waters

only. You can still catch, measure and photograph these fish, or focus your efforts on gag grouper which are still in season as of this date. Gags should be coming closer to shore and can even be found

inshore as the water cools down with each passing cold front. Check out reefs and wrecks or the areas around crab pots.

You can catch grouper by bottom fishing or trolling with a variety of lures at about 3-4 mph. I like using lures that dive to 20' to 30'+, like the Bomber CD30, Rapala X-Rap Divebait, and Yozuri Crystal Minnow. For grouper, these are more effective when fished with fluorocarbon instead of wire leaders, but plan on losing some lures to kingfish and late departing barracuda.

Remember, fish caught with a paid guide don't count for this contest, and you must measure the total length of these fish to the nearest 1/2" (you may round up). Also remember, goliath grouper don't count in any of our contests since they're a protected species. Black grouper do count, however, if you're lucky enough to catch one within our 50 nautical mile radius fishing boundary from Charlotte Harbor.

Always make sure and check the latest applicable regulations in effect for where you are fishing and for what you are catching, especially if you plan to keep your catch. Your grouper FOM entries are due no later than midnight November 30.

nice trout, snook, tripletail and pompano. A total of 41 anglers submitted 130 entries in October. I guess the snowbirds have started to return. Welcome back!

## Things to Know


1. <u>Federal Waters</u> - An in-season closure for greater amberjack and red grouper is in effect through the end of the year for recreational anglers. Red snapper season closed on June 11, and gag grouper season will close December 3 unless an earlier in-season closure date is announced. The Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council publishes rules governing recreational fishing in federal waters (9 nautical miles off the west coast of FL). Check their rules and updates periodically to stay current with seasons and limits for harvesting all saltwater fish at: http://www.gulfcouncil.org


**2.** <u>State Waters</u> - FWC has not closed the red grouper or greater amberjack season for recreational anglers but has previously approved raising the minimum size limit of greater amberjack to a 34" fork length pending similar Federal regulatory changes. Red snapper season closes on November 2, snook season will close on December 1 and gag grouper season closes December 4. The Florida Fish & Wildlife Commission (FWC) governs recreational saltwater fishing rules in state waters. Check FWC rules and updates periodically to stay current with seasons and limits for harvesting all saltwater fish at: http://www.myfwc.com

<u>No-Harvest Fish</u> - Members should be aware that there are numerous species in our waters that are legally protected and designated as no-harvest fish. Familiarize yourselves with both state and federal regulations governing such species. One is not allowed to remove such species from the water when dehooking them. Also refer to our website for articles concerning proper handling of fish intended for release, which PGIFC encourages.
 <u>Points-Fish Catches</u> - We continue to accumulate points for large fish being caught, and since March, more than half of the monthly points continue to come from inshore rather than offshore catches. The point fish charts are shown below.


We accumulated 6900 points this October compared to 5800 points in October of 2014, and we're now ahead by 5700 points compared to **ALL** of last year. September data was revised to reflect late submittals, which resulted in redfish accounting for more points than tarpon last month. Perhaps September is becoming the new October for redfish, since more points redfish were caught in September both in 2014 and 2015 than in October.

Other October observations: First month this year without points grouper (likely result of in-season closure & weather), nice seatrout are starting to reappear and tarpon were plentiful in the upper Harbor again this year.

# Fishing Program

#### Randy Burchacki Programs



Capt Dan Cambern of Hammerhead charters provided an informative talk on off-shore fishing for Grouper. Capt Dan starts his off-shore trips by stopping at the markers to catch bait fish with sabiki rigs. He suggested adding a little bit of squid or shrimp to hooks for better success. He adds a 1-2 oz pyramid sinker to the rig. For Grouper he

looks for swiss cheese type bottoms and anchors most of the time once he finds a spot. He mentioned that he has done better this year in 75-80 ft of water for red grouper. While anchored he usually puts out a flat line with live bait for other species. He added that he also uses frozen sardines and squid for grouper bait. He touched on using Stretch Lures for Trolling, mainly using Stretch 20 ft or 30 ft lures. He still has a downrigger but with the availability of the Stretch Lures, he hardly ever uses it.

### **PGI NEIGHBORHOOD MARINE WATCH**

The Punta Gorda Isles Neighborhood Marine Watch (NMW) group is alive and doing well. Since it's inception more than five years ago, this group of totally dedicated community volunteers has

grown to over 80 members, many of which, roll out of their warm beds in the middle of the night, grab a hot cup of coffee, get on their boat and head out into the darkness to patrol and observe, reporting to the Punta Gorda Police Dispatcher all boating activity taking place during their night and early morning patrols of the nine inlets leading into the waterfront community of Punta Gorda Isles.

Talk about volunteers being dedicated to serving their community! Not many communities can boast about a group that has formed a community alliance with their local police department to be the eyes and ears to help in keeping their community safe from illegal activities that might include boat theft, the taking of marine equipment and illegal netting activity.

The Punta Gorda Isles Neighborhood Marine Watch Group mission is to provide an "Observe & Report Surveillance" service for all PGI resident home owners. The group's policy of "No contact – No confrontation" with suspected illegal activity is a policy that is strictly adhered to by all members. PGI Marine Watch members while on patrol are in communications with the Punta Gorda Police Department dispatcher and is directed by the dispatcher as to further action, if any, that should be taken.
