PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB JIM'S FISHING REPORT

September's Fish of the Month is spotted seatrout. Your best bet is going to be to fish the grass beds and cleaner water down in Pine Island Sound. Fish on grass flats in 3 to 5 feet that drop into deeper water.

Resident tarpon can be located in the upper harbor in the 20 foot holes. Lady fish have been plentiful and are the preferred bait at this time of year. Don't be surprised if your lady fish is taken by a good size bull shark.

Snook season opens Sept. 1 till Nov. 31. Look for moving water around points, creek mouths, and structure. They've even moved back into the PGI canals. You can also find black drum in the canals and around the bridges.

Redfish are moving back into the Harbor. Chunk baits under the mangroves at high tide and into potholes on lower tides. In the lower harbor there are reports of flounder and pompano. There are also big schools of jacks to 10 lb. roaming the Harbor.

Snapper continue to be on fire inshore and offshore. In the harbor, fish around bridges, in the canals, Alligator reef, and Boca Grande Pass.

For red grouper, you'll need to get out to 110 feet of water, or about 40 miles over hard bottom. Gags can be found in a wider range of depths. Look for them around structure and ledges. Further offshore, wahoo have been caught. Kingfish are beginning to come back thru and have been caught as close as the power poles.

September and October is the peak of the hurricane season. As I write this, it looks like the tropical depression that is off Cuba is going to strengthen as Hermine curves back over Florida. It looks like we could get quite a bit of rain, which would be a good thing. It should cool down the water in the Harbor and set the stage for turning on a terrific fall bite.



Rich Brennan and Aaron Wagner September FOM is Spotted Seatrout

Did you know; Rich Brennan holds the club record for a 29"Seatrout that he caught on the East Wall close to mangroves back in 2009. Then, in 2012 Rich Brennan took Arron Wagner out fishing on his boat, and Aaron tied Rich's club record by also catching another 29" Seatrout; while fishing on the West Wall, about 50 ft. from the mangroves. In addition, Rich, being the nice guy that he is, didn't even toss Aaron off the back of his boat.

Rich and Aaron are both Grand Master Anglers with a wealth of fishing knowledge, and Rich agreed to share some of his tricks of the trade. This is some of Rich's advice. Seatrout prefer clear cooler water, and the best time to fish for them is in the summer, in the early morning. Rich also prefers fishing near the Mangroves, as the fish prefer the shade. He strongly recommends that you "eliminate noise". You need to know, that like Snook and Redfish, Seatrout scare easy, and if a boat comes in fast and loud, they have already scared the fish away. Come in slow and quiet, shut your engine off and drift or troll and keep the noise on your boat down to a minimum. If you are fishing with shrimp, use a popping cork with about 4 ft. of line and let it drift along and "pop it" every so often to get the trout's attention. However, Rich's favorite lure is his Sebile and this is what Rich and Aaron both used to catch their club record Seatrouts. Just a FYI, the pictures above of Rich and Aaron are fairly recent, each with 22" Seatrout.

Remember, fish caught with a guide don't count in the FOM contest. Be sure to submit your FOM pictures prior to month end, to: fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org



The ladies had a great time for lunch at *Curry and Kabob* and dinner at *Carmelo's*. I always forget to take pictures because we are having so much fun.

On deck for September 2016, we are planning to have our Ladies' Lunch at *Sandra's Restaurant* on Thursday, September 8th and Ladies' Night Out for dinner at *Scotty's Brew House* in Fisherman's Village on Thursday, September 22nd. Emails with more specifics will be sent out to the ladies.

Joe and I had a great day fishing a few weeks ago. We caught a few Tarpon, Flounder and Pompano. Here is one of my favorite ways to cook Flounder (or any light white fish such as Pompano). It is also great with chicken.

2 Eggs, beaten	1/4 teaspoon Onion Powder
1 tablespoon Olive Oil	1/4 teaspoon Garlic Powder
1 tablespoon Butter	1/8 teaspoon Paprika
1/2 cup Flour	1/8 teaspoon Black Pepper
1/4 teaspoon Salt	4 large Flounder Fillets (1 1/2 - 2 pounds)
Sauce	
4 tablespoons Butter	1/4 cup Lemon Juice
1/4 cup White Wine	1/2 teaspoon Parsley
1/4 cup Water	Lemon Slices and Parsley for garnish

Flounder Francaise

1. In a large skillet, heat the oil and 1 Tbsp. of butter over medium heat.

- 2. Place the flout and all the seasonings in a plastic bag and shake to blend.
- 3. Place the beaten eggs in a shallow dish.
- 4. When the skillet is good and hot, put the flounder fillets in the bag one at a time and ten dip in the egg. Coat them completely with the egg and place in the skillet. The egg should sizzle immediately. If it doesn't, the oil isn't hot enough.
- 5. Save 1 tablespoon of the flour mixture for the sauce.
- 6. Fry over medium heat until brown on both sides, about 3 to 4 minutes per side. Add extra butter if you need to.
- 7. Remove from skillet, keep warm.
- 8. Discard any oil left in skillet and add the 4 Tbsp. and the 1 Tbsp of seasoned flour reserved from the flounder. Whisk until smooth. Add the rest of the sauce ingredients, stirring constantly until well blended. Bring to boil and cook 5 minutes, stirring frequently. If the sauce thickens too much, add more water-just 1 tsp at a time until you achieve the desired consistency.
- 9. To serve place over a bed of buttered rice (quinoa, spinach, etc.) and pour a little sauce over each fillet. Garnish with lemon slices and parsley.









If you can volunteer no more then 2-hours each month and have a boat, then you may want to consider becoming a member of one of the most unique community volunteer groups in Southwest Florida. Each day of the month PGI NMW members rise up in the night and early morning hours, launch their personal boats and go "On Patrol" to observe and report all suspicious boating or land activity to the Punta Gorda Police Department night dispatcher.

We prefer all members have a boat that they can use for their monthly patrol. However, you do not have to own a boat to become a member. You can act as "crew" during any other members patrol or, in the event of inclement weather or other unsafe "on-the-water" conditions, perform your 2-hour patrol at predesignated land locations in your vehicle.

The preferred boat size is 17 to 23 feet, with either a T-top or bow rail to display "Patrol Boat" signage that identifies your vessel as a PGI Neighborhood Marine Watch Patrol Boat.


