- Status of ongoing activities
- Updated monthly and ongoing Fishing Club contest results from the Fishing Events Director or

 Angler, Isles Trophy Race and any others which
 might occur during the month)
- Appropriate images/photos of member catches, reworked and resized as necessary, along with any other images/photos appropriate to the newsletter
- Any other local area news deemed appropriate and of interest to the club membership.

The editor will, no later than the first week of the month, make the completed newsletter available to the club membership as a .PDF (Portable Document Format) file.

The editor should receive feature columns and other articles, in whatever format the author desires, for incorporation no later than the 20th of each month to enable publication in a timely manner (except the updates from the Fishing Events Director and Fishing Events Record Keeper, which must await the end of the month).

Other articles, letters to the editor and such may be submitted at anytime, in any clearly readable format, but if they are submitted later than the 20th of the month, they may or may not be incorporated into the upcoming newsletter.

The editor will "edit" all information submitted for publication as deemed necessary.

<u>The Web master</u> will design, layout and format the PGI Fishing Club Website, incorporating:

- The pgifishingclub.org Web domain email address (<u>fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org</u>) for members to submit fish entries
- Other pgifishingclub.org Web domain email addresses as needed

It's that easy, and it enters your catch into all of the Club's programs and contests as long as you satisfy each of the respective revised rules for these events. While you're on the computer, why not also post your pictures on the Cub's Facebook page so we can all get a real time idea of what's biting. Our Club's Facebook membership continues to grow and I like that.

We also had our Club's first of three planned fishing outings on a lovely but very wet Monday, March 24. At least we didn't have high winds or thunder & lightening. The soggy weather didn't stop 16 of the 23 registered boats from braving the elements for a chance at one of four \$25 gift certificates. The lucky (and skilled) anglers were: Joe Maillet for a 19" spotted seatrout; Jim Qurollo for a 34.5" snook (Jim wished it was 1.5 inches shorter); Marv Dyrstad for his 15" redfish (caught off his dock); and Mark **Storm** for his virtual grouper caught via a random drawing of registered names of participants present for the awards presentation at Harpoon Harry's. **Ted** Perrin actually did catch a 25" red grouper way offshore but couldn't make it back in time to be eligible for a prize. Over 60 participants, their families and/ or friends were on hand to share stories, cheer on the winners and support Harpoon Harry's for providing us with a dry space within which to socialize and imbibe. Thank you all for participating!


Our April FOM contest is for Spanish Mackerel. Measure these fish from the tip of the nose (watch out for the teeth) to the fork in their tail (not total length), and remember to round off your measurement to the nearest half inch (there seem to be a lot of measuring sticks being used that only have 1 inch increments). These fish have been all over the Harbor in March from the Gulf all the way up to and beyond the Route 41 bridge. Look for diving birds to find bigger schools of them but the birds haven't been the best tell-tale in March. Our birds are either getting too lazy to fly or they're on a diet. The Spanish mackerel have been easy to catch on shrimp under a float and on artificial lures like silver spoons, Gotcha lures and any fast and erratically moving twitch baits or jig heads tipped with plastic lures like paddle tails. I recommend using a steel leader or a heavy monofilament leader to mitigate cutoffs. Also, I like switching out any treble hooks with single

hooks to reduce my chance of getting hurt, and improve the survival rate of the ones I release. They should stick around for April so lots of entries are expected. The trick will be to catch BIG ones and properly identify your catch. Juvenile king mackerel can sometimes be confused with Spanish mackerel, so below we're providing a comparison guide to aid in your identification of Spanish mackerel.

Spanish vs. King Mackerel Identification




Always make sure and check the latest applicable regulations in effect for where you are fishing and for what you are catching, especially if you plan to keep some fish. Also remember that you can't use a

paid guide for any contests except the Ladder of Angling Achievement (LOA) Program, and your April FOM entries are due no later than May 1. Come on Snowbirds, one last hurrah before departing to the cool northern latitudes. Please drive safely and hurry back soon.

All current contest results are nicely summarized later in this Newsletter, and awards for March will be handed out at our next general meeting on April 8. We again have two special awards to present this month. Aaron Wagner is getting his Grand Master Angler shirt for achieving that status on March 8, and Karen Lodge set a new women's Club record for king mackerel with her 38.0" fish caught on March 23!!!

Come before 7 pm on April 8 to leave enough time to pick up your raffle and 50/50 tickets, and to grab a good seat. C U then!

PS Remember that snook season is still open until April 30, but you need a \$10 snook permit to harvest snook if you also need a fishing license, even if it's a \$0.00 shoreline license. Check the rules and avoid the fines.

Our March speaker was Mike Meyers of Reelshark Charters. We had over 100 members in attendance and Mike focused on Snook and Redfish as well

as Speckled Trout. He said that fishing in the area was great.

He suggested the Redfish are in Widden Creek. Use artificials, Mirror Lure or Little John. They are not in the trees, you have to find them in potholes. The West wall and Turtle Bay hold some reds as well.

Snook are in all harbor inlets in outgoing tides. Use big bait for big Snook. 15" whole ladyfish, sugar trout will work. Hook them through the top to the bottom of the head. Use circle hooks and give them 5-10 seconds after the first hit to start pulling them. When reeling in a fish, open the bail. Fish will stop then pull again. He was catching many large 35", 36" and 38" Snook.

The trout are on the grass flats all on the East Wall in 2-4 ft of water. Use soft twitch plastics on ¼ oz jigs. He said he caught 50 trout in one hour. Some in Alligator Creek.

Our April Speaker will be Rhett Morris who has spoken frequently for us. He will be discussing the catching of Spanish Mackerel as well as other topics.

"Corks & Canvas" was a paint class held in the new community building. Our instructor Ashley showed us how to paint a



Don't forget, I'm the eternal optimist. No smile is too small to share.




Thoughts on Hook Safety

You can't have fished for as many years as I have without getting "hooked," both literally and figuratively. Fishing hooks are dangerous but effective tools, and believe me, they can be difficult to remove from your tough skin.

Joe briefly mentioned hook safety in his Fishing Events article...switching out treble hooks for single hooks for your safety and improved fish survival if released. There are a few things you can do to make fishing hooks safer to handle and use like: reduce the damage a barb can do to you and the fish by squeezing it flat or nearly flat with pliers, use hook covers over lures while attached to the hook keeper or lower guide on your pole, use good hook removing tools other than your fingers, watch your back cast, know you're fishing partners' casting habits, and always carry a good first aid kit on your boat.

To paraphrase an old Naval Aviation axiom: "Aviation (or fishing) in itself is not inherently dangerous. But like the sea, it is terribly unforgiving of any carelessness, incapacity or neglect"

So, you need to be careful with those sharp, barbed things, especially when one third of a treble hook is embedded in a live fish you're handling!
