for the last 2 years. Since John worked closely with Bob Rand (Record Keeper) and Jim Qurollo (Editor), both of whom are still on board, I believe I can manage to stay out of too much trouble by doing the same. I'm really looking forward to serving as your Fishing Events Director (at least until you fire me).

Needless to say, there's a lot of water to cover since our last general meeting in November because our December Christmas Party was all play and no work (except for our now retired Social Director Sherry Moerke and her group of hard working volunteers who slaved tirelessly providing us with a wonderful evening out).

Namely, I need to summarize December's Fish of the Month (FOM) Contest and Ladder of Angling Achievement (LOA) Program Awards, and Year-End Awards. In addition, as a result of reviewing several years of the Club's past fishing results and talking with a number of members, former Officers and Fishing Events Directors, I want to introduce a few changes to the FOM Contest, LOA Program and Club Tournaments going forward. None of these changes are retroactive so what you've accomplished thus far in your LOA stays in place. We just decided to enhance the contests and programs a little to further incentivize members to do what we do best, and that's GO FISHING! But first, last year's results.

December was black drum month and unlike last year, enough were caught to award all three prizes, barely however, since only 3 entries were received. I know the drum were chewing pretty good on crustaceans at the bridges and in the canals in November, but slowed down a bit in December. I also know that awarding these FOM prizes makes John Wolfinger very happy since it keeps his streak of awarding prizes during each month of 2013 intact. Congratulations go out to:

- **Tom Hickey** 1st place with a \$35 gift certificate to Fishin' Frank's for his 46.5" behemoth black drum.
- **Rich Brennan** 2nd place with a \$25 gift certificate to Laishley Marine for his 23" half-behemoth black drum.
- John Solinger 3rd place with a \$15 gift certificate to Rio Villa Bait and Tackle for his 15" nicely marked juvenile black drum.

If you did catch a black drum in December and didn't submit it, you may have missed out on a great prize. So make sure that if you do catch a fish of the month or any fish for that matter, attach a picture to an email identifying your full name, length and type of fish, date caught and a note if you used a paid guide, and send it to fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org. It's that easy, and it enters your catch into all of the Club's programs and contests as long as you satisfy each of the respective revised rules for these events. The revised rules can be found on the Club's great website at pgifishingclub.org.

While you're on the computer, why not also post your pictures on the Cub's Facebook page so we can all get a real time idea of what's biting.

Our January FOM is sheepshead. As most of you know, just like black drum, sheepshead also love crustaceans and mollusks and in particular shrimp, mud crabs and barnacles, especially this time of year. They hang out near seawalls, dock and trestle pilings, bridge piers and reefs. They are uncanny bait thieves, however, so be quick on the hook set if you're not over reefs and are fishing with J hooks. Although not a reef fish, when fishing for sheepshead over a reef with natural bait you should use a non-stainless steel circle hook. Always make sure and check the latest applicable regulations in effect for where you are fishing. Remember, you can't use a paid guide for any contests except the LOA Program, and your January FOM entries are due no later than February 1.

FOM Contest Rules. The list is almost identical to last year's list except that we switched snook and tarpon so that members can keep their legal sized snook in September if they choose to and the snook season reopens September 1 as anticipated.

The LOA results are nicely summarized later in this Newsletter, and awards for both November and December will be handed out at our next general meeting on January 14. I just want to recognize and congratulate **Tom Hickey** for achieving Grand Master Angler status in November of 2013. That's a tough level to achieve and he earned his shirt and cemented this HUUUGE accomplishment by catching some real nice quality fish this year.

The results for the 2013 Year-End Awards are also summarized below and I look forward to awarding each of the prizes in the Master Angler Tournament (MAT) and Isles Trophy Race (ITR) on January 14. Although I and many others tried hard to get in the winner's circle, we came up short (literally). Congratulations to all the skilled (and somewhat lucky?) anglers who wound up winning these coveted awards.

Lastly, I'll briefly summarize some of the changes to Fishing Events beginning in 2014. More discussion will take place during our January meeting if time allows and during the February general meeting when we perhaps have a less jam-packed meeting agenda.

The FOM Contest will award prizes each month to both the top 3 male and top 3 female an-

glers with the intent to incentivize the women to fish even more and submit their entries. Awarding more prizes to Club members is not a bad thing, right?

An 8th level was added to the LOA Program to continue to motivate Grand Master Anglers (GMA) after they receive their shirt. A star will be awarded to each GMA for accumulating 2000 points during any year after receiving their shirt. I can already envision multistar GMAs among our ranks within a few years.

A July fishing outing/tournament will be added to supplement the outings typically held in March and October, weather permitting. Instead of targeting spotted seatrout, redfish, snook and grouper, the July outing will award prizes to the member catching the longest tarpon, shark, stingray and redfish. Only one prize per member as usual, but it should be fun to see what trophy fish we can catch in the heat of the summer.

A few more revisions were made to the rules governing our LOA, FOM, MAT and ITR programs and contests. Visit our website to read up on all of these rules.

We are truly lucky to fish here and enjoy the weather. So drop a line in the water and catch some fish for a chance to share in the bounty of all that our Club and great area has to offer. Come before 7 pm on January 14 to leave enough time to pick up your raffle and 50/50 tickets, and to grab a good seat. C U then!






