FISHING EVENTS John Wolfinger



s I sit here and write this month's article, I am in northern Illinois where it is 46 degrees and raining outside. Oh, how I miss Punta Gorda! I am going through withdrawal since I haven't been able to fish in a couple of weeks. I really enjoy seeing the fish submissions that our members submit; it makes me look so forward to getting back there in June.

Our Fish of the Month contest for COBIA finished up May 31st and members did not disappoint. Cobia is a tough fish to find and catch but for the 5th month in a row we had winners for all three places. During May we had 8 submissions for the COBIA Fish of the Month contest and we had three winners. Congratulations go out to:

- Jim Qurollo, 1st place (\$35 gift certificate), 39" length to inside fork
- John Solinger, 2nd place (\$25 gift certificate), 35" length to inside fork Pam Solinger, 3rd place (\$15 gift certificate), 34" length to inside fork

Thanks go out to all of the members that submitted pictures of their COBIA catches. If you caught a big one and didn't submit it, you may have missed out on a great gift certificate. It's easy to submit entries; just e-mail a picture of you with the fish along with your name, date caught, length and type of fish to PGIFishingClub@pgica.org or drop off a picture with the same information at the PGICA office.

The June "Fish of the Month" is SNOOK. There have been many great Snook catches made this year, including a new club record. Now the true test will come to see who can catch that big one during the month of June. These fish have recovered very nicely from the freezes in 2010 and 2011, but to date, there hasn't been a decision made by FWC whether the season will definitely reopen this year. So, the Snook you catch for this month's contest are ALL catch-and-release. Handle them carefully, get your measurement and photo quickly, then spend a little time reviving them before you let them go. Snook are measured as total length; tip of nose to tip of tail.

For those of you that like to fish offshore, we are entering a great time of the year. The season for Red Snapper opened in the Gulf on June 1st and will be open for 40 days. That is a really short season, but if you get the chance, these are a great fish to catch and an even better fish for eating. These are one of my personal favorites for the table. In our area, Red Snapper aren't a fish that you'll catch in the Harbor or anywhere close. You'll need to probably target depths of at least 100 feet in the Gulf; that's a long way out. The limit is 2 per angler and they must be at least 16" total length.

The July Fish of the Month will be SHARK. Summer is usually an active time for sharks in the harbor. Since estimating a shark's length can be very subjective, we're giving awards in July based on the number caught. *But there will be a little twist*. Since catching a big shark is an achievement, any shark 5 feet or longer to the fork will count as "3". We still need pictures of the fish you catch, but because of the danger that can be associated with bringing a big shark on board, you can take the picture of the shark in the water. No, you don't have to be in the photo with it! So say you catch three, 3' sharks and one, 5' shark during the month of July; your total will equal 6. It's that simple.

One additional reminder; if you are working on your Ladder of Achievement, a 5' shark is also worth 300 points; a 50 inch shark is worth 200 points and a 40 inch shark is worth 100 points. So if you need points for your Ladder of Achievement, be sure to send in the estimated length to the fork with the photo. All species of sharks get credit, so you don't need to be concerned with identifying the species. Bob Rand will make sure you get credit for both the monthly contest and Ladder if he gets the correct information.

Now take advantage of living in one of the best fishing areas in the country and GO FISH!



RECIPE OF THE MONTH

PAN-SEARED TILAPIA W/CHILE LIME BUTTER



INGREDIENTS

For chile lime butter:

- 1/4 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped shallots
- 1 teaspoon finely grated fresh lime zest
- 2 teaspoons fresh lime juice
- 1 teaspoon minced fresh Serrano chilies, Including seeds
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

For Fish:

6 (5 ounce) skinless tilapia fillets 1/2 teaspoon salt, to taste 2 tablespoons vegetable oil

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Make chile lime butter.
- 2. Stir together butter, shallot, zest, lime juice, chile & salt in a bowl.
- 3. Prepare fish.
- 4. Pat fish dry & sprinkle with salt.
- 5. Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a 120inch nonstick skillet over moderately high heat until just smoking.
- 6. Sauté 3 pieces of fish, using a spatula to turn once, until golden & just cooked through, 4 to 5 minutes.
- 7. Transfer to a plate and sauté remaining fish in same manner.
- 8. Serve each piece of fish with a dollop of chile lime butter.
