Editor's Notes

Fish Photos

A s the club grows, it becomes more important that photos are submitted in the proper format

with the required information. The emailed fish photos that club members submit to the email address **fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org** are used in various ways.

Bob Rand, our Fishing Events Record Keeper keeps track of all fish entries and each individual member's Ladder of Angling Achievement. He uses the submitted photos along with the required text information with each photo to ensure that you get credit in your climb to which ever rung on the ladder you aspire.

Joe Udwari, our Fishing Events Director uses the photos for all fishing contest entries. With the coordination of the Fishing Events Record Keeper, he determines eligible entries, species, and winners in the Fish of the Month, Master Angler Tournament and Isles Trophy Race.

As Editor I use the photos for the newsletter and Web site.

We now have over 500 members and routinely receive <u>well over</u> one hundred photos ever month. Bob processes and keeps records of the photos. Joe uses many of the photos in the slide presentations at our monthly club meetings, both before the

meeting begins and during his presentation of Fishing Events status. I can't put them all in the newsletter, but try to use a representative group. Most all the photos submitted are eventually posted to the photo gallery pages of our Web site for a few months before I phase out the older ones.

As you might imagine, processing all those fish photos can become a time consuming task, especially if we need to follow up and get clarification because the original photo submitted didn't have the required information or was in the wrong format. So, here is how to submit your fish photo:

- Submit it by email as an <u>attached file</u>
- Ensure it is in .jpg (or .jpeg) format
- Include text in your email with: 1.) your first and last name, 2.) fish species, 3.) fish length measured to the pinched tail or fork as appropriate, 4) date caught, and 5) whether it was caught with a paid guide.

If you submit a photo in another format and missing required information, it makes our jobs much more difficult. Sometimes, we just don't have the time or maybe can't take the time to try and convert a photo or exchange emails to get the needed info.

If you don't know how to submit a photo by email, ask for help. We have many members who have been emailing photos without a problem and would be glad to help.

Fishing Events

In my opinion, fishing offshore has been better than fishing inshore so far this year. The inshore fish must be upset about something or just plain not eating.

With the scarcity of bait in the Harbor so far, one would think they'd gobble up anything that is served up on a platter. On the other hand, some of our Club's anglers have been producing quality fish inshore including cobia, snook, redfish and shark. I can only hope it gets better inshore for me personally since the gas bills for offshore trips are expensive.

Our April Fish of the Month (FOM) contest was for Spanish mackerel. We had fewer entries than I anticipated; only 12 members submitted entries. Maybe that proves my observation and/or our snowbirds headed home early. However, we once more had a complete suite of both male angler and female angler winners.

If you did catch a Spanish mackerel in April and didn't submit it, you may have missed out on a great prize. So make sure that if you do catch a fish of the month or any fish for that matter, attach a picture to an email identifying your full name, length and type of fish, date caught and a note if you used a paid guide, and send it to fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org. It's that easy, and it enters your catch into all of the Club's programs and contests as long as you satisfy each of the respective revised rules for these events. The revised rules can be found on the Club's great website at pgifishingclub.org.

While you're on the computer, why not also post your pictures on the Cub's Facebook page so we can all get a real time idea of what's biting. Our Club's Facebook membership continues to grow and I like that.

Our May FOM contest is for cobia. Also measure these fish from the tip of the nose to the fork in their tail (not total length), and remember to round off your measurement to the nearest half inch. If your fish is a hair's width longer than the 1/4" increment (without stepping on it of course), then round it up to the next 1/2" increment. If not, round it down. Cobia have been all over the middle to upper Harbor this month. Joe Maillet and Bob Busler have caught quite a few so ask them to share their knowledge on how, when and where. I can't help you since I can't catch them. I see them occasionally, but just can't get them to bite. A real jinx fish for me.

Always make sure and check the latest applicable regulations in effect for where you are fishing and for what you are catching, especially if you plan to keep some fish. Also remember that you can't use a paid guide for any contests except the Ladder of Angling Achievement (LOA) Program, and your May FOM entries are due no later than June 1.

All current contest results are nicely summarized later in this Newsletter, and awards for April will be handed out at our next general meeting on May 13.

Jim Qurollo is going to receive his Grand Master Angler shirt for catching his 23rd species recently. Congratulations Jim! He's had enough points for quite some time but was waiting for that special fish to take his offering. It's one that's not very common in our area, and takes lightening reflexes and special skills to catch; an Atlantic Croaker. I bet he'd tell you most of his fishing secrets if you volunteered to assume his role as Newsletter Editor starting July 1. We need your help so please volunteer some of your time to help the Club and give Jim a well deserved rest. He'll still be volunteering some of his time as our Club's webmaster and can help you transition into the Editor role. It's fun. Oh yeah, I almost forgot to mention I got my GMA Star this month.

Come before 7 pm on May 13 to leave enough time to pick up your raffle and 50/50 tickets, and to grab a good seat. C U then!



Currently, the PGI Fishing Club's annual dues are \$20 per household (of up to 2 adults). You know by attending our meetings that our club subsidizes events such as the picnic or year-end party. The club purchases the hats, rods, reels, nets, other various items of tackle and the gift cards used at the meetings AND the master angler shirt you will win when you qualify.

What once might have cost \$60 in 2005, costs close to if not over \$100 today. The Board has voted to increase the membership dues next year (2015) by a minimum of \$5.00 per household. Many of the other clubs in the PGICA has a minimum annual dues of \$30 or more so we're not asking a lot. We're hoping that you'd even consider a \$10 annual increase bringing the yearly dues to a very low \$30.00. Heck, if you win a rod at one of our meetings, the dues has already paid for that prize. What we don't want to do is begin minimizing the prizes by being forced to purchase inferior tackle due to lack of funds.

So, we're going to ask for a raise of hands at the June 10 general meeting to see if you'll agree to a \$10.00 annual increase. That's our first choice. We'll work from there. By voting in June, this allows ample time for any discussion and notification in accordance with our by-laws. The Board is working hard to continue to increase your benefits of membership and a dues increase will aid in this endeavor.

Now, I'm really out of room. Any more writing and they'll throw away my computer. After all, this is NOT my newsletter; it's yours and I need to leave room for everyone else.

That said, please remember to go out of your way to greet our newbies. Make them feel welcomed. That new friend you make just might turn out to be your new best buddy.


