n October 9th our PGI Fishing Club

President forwarded, via email to all club members, a letter about a proposed regional private landfill in Charlotte County. I hope you all read the letter, but here are some quotes from the Web site www.stopcalusagreen.com which provides more information about this grass roots effort to stop the landfill.

Our valuable land and water resources in East Charlotte County (off Bermont Road, East of HWY 31) are under attack by landfill developers. These investors, (Laishley, Treworgy, Bayne, Waksler, Sullivan and Lang) are trying to lay the groundwork with our local elected officials to build a garbage dump 500% bigger than our current County Owned facility on Zemel Road. They initially plan to accept household trash, construction debris and sewage sludge from all over state including Miami.

Calusa Green LLC, a Delaware Corporation incorporated on September 6, 2012 is attempting to get a zoning change to the 2050 comprehensive plan.

A new private landfill is not in the long term plan for our county. These investors want the county commissioners to approve a zoning change from agriculture to planned development (PD) to allow them to put a 554 acre landfill right in the middle of the headwaters that supply drinking water to Punta Gorda and right in the middle of our Produce Farms, Cattle Ranches and Protected Wildlife Corridors...

Everyone must get involved to put a stop to this short-sighted idea by a handfull of local and out of state developers that a regional landfill won't impact anyone.

Calusa's attorney, Geri Waksler, who is also an

investor, actually testified to the Planning and Zoning board that this landfill won't effect anyone. This statement alone shows their total lack of understanding about our local economy and the citizens who live, work and raise their families in East Charlotte County.

Please call or email the Board of County Commissioners to let them know that you are opposed to changing the zoning in the 2050 plan because we do not need a private landfill. Let them know it will severely damage our two biggest industries (tourism and agriculture). Let them know you expect them to protect the citizens from this potential harm to our local economy.

The PGI Fishing Club should support the effort to stop this proposed landfill. I hope that the PGICA will do the same. As concerned members of this community who enjoy the water and wildlife, please email or call the County Commissioners with your thoughts on the landfill. NEED CONTRIBUTING AUTHORS

Many of us have joined this club to learn more about fishing in our local area. Most of us came here with primarily fresh water experience. Some of our knowledge and equipment was applicable, and some was not. We also have some members with very limited fishing experience. We are dedicated to adding to every member's knowledge.

We now have a web site that allows us to archive fishing tips and suggestions. All we need are some contributing authors.

Fortunately, we have some expert anglers in our club. A few have made a contribution, and we have those articles for all to see. I am requesting that if you have any particular knowledge, that you share it in a short article for the monthly newsletter, and for archiving on our web site for future reference and for new members.

I am listing a few suggestions here. This is not intended to limit the scope of any information on fishing the local area you are willing to share.

1. Rods and reels:

 if new to fishing in Charlotte Harbor, types of rods and reels recommended for different types of fishing.

2. Line:

- type of line and line weight for specific type of fishing;
- comparison of braid and monofilament;
- type, weight, and length of leader.

3. Knots:

- since it has been suggested that each person know at least three knots that they tie well, list some good knots to use in different fishing situations;
- provide a web site that shows how to tie each knot (or recommend the Fishing Knots link on our Web site's "Fishing Club Web Links" page).

4. Live bait:

- explain how different types of bait is rigged;
- suggest types and size of hooks.

5. Artificial bait:

different lure types for different species.

6. Fishing locations:

- this could be the subject for at least five articles;
- the harbor could be divided into four geographical areas with an additional article for offshore.

Any of the suggestions listed above could be a topic for more than one article.

hat a change from the beginning of October to the end of October. The Harbor water temperatures were in the 80's when we started and by the end of the month they are in the 60's; that's going to bring on a lot

of changes when it comes to fishing.

The last week of October was a tough week to fish because of the windy conditions that we experienced. We went for many days with strong northeast winds that really had the Harbor churning. I'm sure the gag grouper loved that since the season for them ended October 31st and not many fishermen were able to go after them that last week. A likely benefit of the winds is that they may have helped reduce the red tide concentrations that were fairly high in mid-October in the Boca Grande Pass area. The recent red tide reports as of 10/31 show much lower levels than mid-month. Let's hope that the levels continue to drop and we won't be dealing with the red tide this winter.

Our October Fish of the Month contest was REDFISH. As we suspected, it was a busy month and we received 17 submissions for the redfish contest. For the eleventh consecutive month we had at least 3 winners. Congratulations go out to:

Thanks go out to the members that submitted pictures of their REDFISH catches. If you caught one

and didn't submit it, you may have missed out on a great gift certificate. It's easy to submit entries; just e-mail a picture of you with the fish along with your name, date caught, length and type of fish to the club's NEW e-mail address for submissions, fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org or drop off a picture with the same information at the PGICA office.

Our November Fish of the Month will be GROUPER. These fish are TOTAL LENGTH; tip of the nose to the tip of the squeezed tail. Although gag grouper season ended on October 31st, they still will qualify for this contest however they must be returned to the water after you take a photo. Red grouper season is still open and they may be kept in accordance with FWC regulations. Goliath grouper do not qualify for this contest; they are protected and must be returned to the water. Also, just a reminder that grouper you catch with a paid inshore guide do not qualify for this contest, however grouper caught with a paid OFFSHORE guide do qualify. Make sure that you get photos of you with the fish submitted no later than December 1st. The awards for the November grouper winners will be distributed at our January meeting since our December gathering will be the Christmas party.

We held our second Fishing Club outing on October 16th and we had a great time! We had over 30 participants and awarded \$25 gift certificates for the longest snook, redfish, seatrout and grouper. The awards were distributed at a post-fishing event held at Harpoon Harry's where we celebrated and told a lot of fishing stories! The award winners were:



I'm the eternal optimist. No smile is too small to share.








