- Contact Us—Tells where to get club email addresses and phone numbers.
- Member Inputs and Comments—If members have information that might be useful for other members, they can be added to this page.
- Photo Gallery—Originally had most of the fish photos submitted by club members. Grew too large so reduced to recent past months.

Some of the pages are obviously "boiler plate" items most will never read, but other pages do have quite a bit of useful information. Take a little time and explore your Web site. You might be surprised and learn something.



Things to Know



NAVIGATION HAZARD

Here's a photo that should be of interest to anyone who might go near to Cape Haze Shoal Light 6... Marker 6 to most of us. You know, the marker Mike fishes around most of the time. I drifted across this hazard a couple of months or so ago when the harbor was still clear enough to see more than six inches under the surface, and luckily it was near high tide. A surprise that could do real damage to your boat (and already has to other boats). Thanks to Bob Mayes for forwarding this photo from the Peace River Power Squadron.

PROHIBITED SPECIES (From the FWC Web site)

It is unlawful to harvest, possess, land, purchase, sell, or exchange the following species: Goliath Grouper (Jewfish), Nassau Grouper, Sawfish, Atlantic Angel Shark, Basking Shark, Bigeye Sand Tiger Shark, Bigeye Sixgill Shark, Bigeye Thresher Shark, Bignose Shark, Caribbean Reef Shark, Caribbean Sharpnose Shark, Dusky Shark, Galapagos Shark, Lemon Shark, Longfin Mako Shark, Narrowtooth Shark, Night Shark, Silky Shark, Sand Tiger Shark, Sandbar Shark, Sevengill Shark, Sixgill Shark, Smalltail Shark, Spiny Dogfish, Whale Shark, White Shark, Tiger Shark, Great Hammerhead Shark, Scalloped and Smooth Hammerhead Shark, Manta Ray, Spotted Eagle Ray, Longbill Spearfish, Mediterranean Spearfish, Sturgeon, Florida Queen Conch, Stony, Hard and Fire Corals, Sea Fans, Bahama Starfish, and Longspine Urchin. Harvest of live rock in state waters is prohibited. Puffer fish harvest is prohibited in Volusia, Brevard, Indian River, St. Lucie and Martin counties.

Judging from the above list, it pays to know what you are catching. But if a catch isn't on the PROHIBITED SPECIES list, it might be out of season or might not fit into the established legal size restrictions usually established for species management purposes. Or you may not even know what species it is...legal, prohibited, good to eat, or what? If you have a smart phone, you can install the application "Fish Rules 2013" which is available for both the iPhone and Android smart phones (see the Fishing Club Web Links page here: http://pgifishingclub.org/wordpress/?page_id=101 for more information.) If no smart phone, send a photo of your catch to fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org and we'll try our best to identify it. Or, you can go to Web saltwater fish ID sites like the FWC's http://myfwc.com/wildlifehabitats/profiles/fish/saltwater/ which is one of the best. Lots of resources available. Even old salts run into occasional fish they can't immediately identify.

Come October when redfish is our fish-of-the-month, the bite should be on fire. We've also had some great successes off shore but getting out there is difficult with all of the afternoon storms we have been having. Vinnie Madsen caught a beautiful 58" wahoo and a 40" dolphin fish on the same day offshore in August. They are both rare catches for our area but proves to us that they can be caught.

The downside is, we've had very few reports of members hooking up tarpon yet. Let's hope that changes soon with tarpon being our fish-of-the-month for September.

Our fish-of the-month for August was mangrove snapper. Although we did have quite a few caught, they were all on the small side. The good news is we did finish the eighth month in a row with winners. Congratulations go out to:

GROVE SNAPPER catches. If you caught one and didn't submit it, you may have missed out on a great gift certificate. It's easy to submit entries; just e-mail a picture of you with the fish along with your name, date caught, length and type of fish to the club's e-mail address for submissions, fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org or drop off a picture with the same information at the PGICA office. Just a reminder that we will be eliminating the submission of paper photos soon so if you need any help in how to submit a photo electronically let us know.

As I mentioned earlier, our Fish-of-the-Month for September is TARPON. This is one of the premier fish for our area and probably one of the most exciting to catch. Unlike most months where we award prizes for length, we will be awarding three prizes for the most tarpon caught in September. Tarpon are considered catch and release only and should not be brought into the boat, even for photos. A photo of the fish alongside the boat in the water is required but you do not have to be in the photo. It is considered a catch if you touch the leader. A tarpon that escapes before you touch the leader is not considered a catch. As always, fish caught with paid guides don't qualify for this contest. Remember to submit all entries to fishphotos@pgifishingclub.org no later than October 1st.

October's Fish-of-the-Month will be REDFISH and this will be an extremely competitive month since this is the favorite of many members. October is a great month to catch redfish, so get ready.

HOLD THE DATE: We will be holding a PGI Fishing Club outing on Tuesday, October 15. This is open free to all members but we will be requesting that members sign up in advance. A signup sheet will be passed around at the September 10th club meeting, and the October 8th club meeting will be your last chance to signup. This event is just for fun and hopefully we can get members out fishing that may not get out too often. We will also offer a \$25 gift certificate for the longest redfish, snook, spotted seatrout and gag or red grouper for the day (one prize per member). The outing will be followed by a gathering at 3-4 PM at Harpoon Harry's where we will brag and hand out the awards. 

PUNTA GORDA ISLES NEIGHBORHOOD MARINE WATCH... MAKING A DIFFERENCE!



Members of the Punta Gorda Isles Neighborhood Marine Watch (NMW) Group of volunteers, with the sanction of the Punta Gorda Police Department and the PGI Civic Association conduct a once a month, On-the-Water night surveillance patrol. (1) Each month members decide, from a spread of days, which date and time they choose for their patrol. (2) Members use their own boats and are equipped with provided

signage identifying their vessel as a NMW patrol boat. Patrol locations will coincide with the each members "home dock".

(3) Our patrols sit on each of the nine (9) inlets into our canal system. The dates and times for our patrols are confidential.

(4) After a soft background check by the PGPD, each member is issued a personal I.D. card/number, a copy of the NMW group "On-The Water Conduct & Procedures", and a map of all inlets to the PGI canal system.

(5) I will personally "Crew" with all new members on their first patrol.




