- 4. I've taken a personal interest in looking for opportunities to reduce fish loss (largely grouper) associated with bringing fish up from the depths and then not facilitating their safe release. Joe Udwari is our resident expert and has shared his experiences with us before. Even FWC vacillates on methods e.g. venting tool. Other than venting, that brings hazards, there are also some "kludges" available to get a fish back down. I'd hate to have to mess with. With my engineer hat I was impressed by a simple device called "SeaQualizer", with jaws like a "grabber" that will release at a preset depth. Not that expensive, I purchased one to rotate around to some of our off-shore folks to get their experiences. I'll let you know the outcome. From my limited offshore experiences I hated seeing small grouper floating belly-up. We are complaining about having to go further out. Maybe there's a little something we can do about it.

Safety Alert 13-18

Let us enlighten you about LED lighting!
Potential interference of VHF-FM Radio and AIS Reception.

The U.S. Coast Guard has received reports from crews, ship owners, inspectors and other mariners regarding poor reception on VHF frequencies used for radiotelephone, digital selective calling (DSC) and automatic identification systems (AIS) when in the vicinity of light emitting diode (LED) lighting on-board ships (e.g., navigation lights, searchlights and floodlights, interior and exterior lights, adornment).

Radio frequency interference caused by these LED lamps were found to create potential safety hazards. For example, the maritime rescue coordination center in one port was unable to contact a ship involved in a traffic separation scheme incident by VHF radio. That ship also experienced very poor AIS reception. Other ships in different ports have experienced degradation of the VHF receivers, including AIS, caused by their LED navigation lights. LED lighting installed near VHF antennas has also shown to compound the reception.

Strong radio interference from LED sources may not be immediately evident to maritime radio users. Nonetheless, it may be possible to test for the presence of LED interference by using the following procedures:

- Turn off LED light(s).
- 2. Tune the VHF radio to a quiet channel (e.g. Ch. 13).
- 3. Adjust the VHF radio's squelch control until the radio outputs audio noise.
- 4. Re-adjust the VHF radio's squelch control until the audio noise is quiet, only slightly above the noise threshold.

- 5. Turn on the LED light(s).
 - If the radio now outputs audio noise, then the LED lights have raised the noise floor. (Noise floor is generally the amount of interfering signals / static received beyond the specific signal or channel being monitored.)
- 6. If the radio does not output audio noise, then the LED lights have not raised the noise floor.

If the noise floor is found to have been raised, then it is likely that both shipboard VHF marine radio and AIS reception are being degraded by LED lighting.

In order to determine the full impact of this interference, the Coast Guard **requests** those experiencing this problem to report their experiences to <u>Coast Guard Navigation Center</u>¹. Select "Maritime Telecommunications" on the subject drop down list, then briefly describe the make and model of LED lighting and radios effected, distance from lighting to antennas and radios effected, and any other information that may help understand the scope of the problem.



Dead fish floating on the water and cluttering beaches. Signs posted on beaches cautioning against swimming. Blue green algae along our coast line large enough to be visible from space. Red tide fueled by nutrient pollution reaching unparalleled levels of severity and duration. And the worst could still be ahead if Mosaic's appeal efforts to mine in the Peace River tributary are approved.

These are examples of how our elected officials have failed us, or at least ignored solutions that could have mitigated the problems we are now facing. An example is the overly lengthy plan our county officials have undertaken to stem the onslaught of phosphate, nitrogen and fecal coliform being deposited in our harbor. The majority of the 24,000 septic systems surrounding our harbor were installed 45 years ago. Seventy percent of them leak and would not meet the states minimum standards that were set 20 years ago. The plan put forth to resolve this problem is an overly lengthy 15-years. 15 years!

I recently spoke to one of the community organizers from Desoto County that successfully crafted a grass roots answer to Mosaics attempts to re-zone land for mining phosphate in the Peace River tributary. I asked for suggestions on how we may be able to convince our local elected officials to better address the pollution problems that are putting such great pressure on our fish stocks. Below are his suggestions:

- It's not just about your fishing club. It's about everyone else in the communityespecially those directly affected by what is happening to fish stocks. Without the voice of community members, the movement has no heart.
- Define a narrative based upon facts. Describing how much better fishing once was is an opinion and opinions are easily dismissed. Facts describing how devastating pollution is to fisheries are indisputable.
- Educate the community on your narrative. Hashtags, social media, newspaper articles, and presentations to community groups brings the community together around a common theme.
- Bring community members together with local elected officials to discuss needed policy changes required to support a healthy estuary.

The real nitty gritty isn't so much how to organize a grass roots community movement. Rather, it is the likelihood of starting a steering group within our club. How many from our club are willing to become involved in the effort? If there is a significant participation we can make a measurable contribution. If only a few, the results most likely will be frustrating.

I'm interested in hearing your thoughts.





If you can volunteer no more than 2-hours each month and have a boat, then you may want to consider becoming a member of one of the most unique community volunteer groups in Southwest Florida. Each day of the month PGI NMW members rise up in the night and early morning hours, launch their personal boats and go "On Patrol" to observe and report all suspicious boating or land activity to the Punta Gorda Police Department night dispatcher.

We prefer all members have a boat that they can use for their monthly patrol. However, you do not have to own a boat to become a member. You can act as "crew" during any other members patrol or, in the event of inclement weather or other unsafe "on-the-water" conditions, perform your 2-hour patrol at predesignated land locations in your vehicle.

The preferred boat size is 17 to 23 feet, with either a T-top or bow rail to display "Patrol Boat" signage that identifies your vessel as a PGI Neighborhood Marine Watch Patrol Boat.
