

PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB RANDY'S FISHING REPORT

The Dog Days of summer are here! Harbor water has gone "full root beer" color and is pushing 90 degrees. Fishing remains good though. Trout are all along the east wall; provided you locate grass. Snook are under the 41 bridge...and not so much at snook lights anymore (hard to see the light now!). I'm catching more trout out in Pine Island Sound. Water is always beautiful and the summer high-water tides let me fish otherwise too shallow grass beds. Trout seem to REALLY get into the flats that are far too shallow to fish in the winter...but have plenty of water now. Turtle Bay and the Fish Camps south of Useppa Island have turned off (or slowed) but there are plenty of other spots that are doing well. Turtle Bay, however, is holding large Jacks now. Reports appear to be better during rising tides but the early part of the drop are good too. Keep your eye out for storm cells. It's easy to track them on your phone but it's VERY hard to predict the ones that "pop up" near you.


August is Tarpon month. We've seen many pics of gorgeous tarpon during July and that will undoubtedly continue through August. They are being caught under and near the 41 bridge. And of course, the "three holes" in Charlotte Harbor. I've included a map showing the holes to help you newcomers out. Remember to use heavier tackle: 4000 series reels minimum, medium-heavy rods, and long 40# fluorocarbon leader line. If possible, use three rigs simultaneously. One with a root beer colored Bait Buster, one with a live Ladyfish on the surface and one with cut bait (Ladyfish too) on or near the bottom. Sight fishing for them is tricky, but rolling tarpon at least locate a good starting spot. But just because they roll, doesn't mean they'll eat. Another option is going after juvenile tarpon in the canals. As I write this, I'm looking at four or five two-footers rolling near my boat lift. Cast the Bait Busters near them. They are hard to catch but easier to hook.

TARPON (Megalops atlanticus)

- Estimated measurement is to the fork; shouldn't be boated. See FWC for specifics
- Photo's should be taken with the fish in the water; angler doesn't need to be in the picture. Ability to touch the leader is a qualifying fish
- FOM winners are based on points; not overall length of one fish
- Any Tarpon estimated to be 5' or larger is worth 3 points, anything smaller is 1 point

- Tarpon come to Boca Grande Pass to feed on Pass Crabs; Spring and Summer
- Can be found near the beaches
- They move into the harbor mid-Summer and stay through the first few cold fronts
- Look for them at the deep holes and the bridges (usually early am and pm)
- Some Tarpon stay year-round in the Peace River; Juveniles can be anywhere

Pass and Beach fishing for Tarpon:

Tarpon fishing in The Pass during Hill Tide months can be an exciting challenge to catch one of the most sought-after sport fish. It's exciting to see thousands of Tarpon rolling as well as a lot of boats fishing within 20' of each other.

Pass Crabs are the bait of choice during hill tide months. Jumbo live shrimp will work when the Tarpon show up early; as will live large Threadfins, Pilchards, Pinfish, and other bait fish. A crab net will pay for itself in no time by netting the Pass Crabs during the strong outgoing tide spring to mid-summer months.

Position the boat ahead of the school and let the fish approach the bait. Many people drift through the schools and others use their trolling motors to stay on the fish.

In Boca Pass April, May and June only 3 lines per boat can be in the water and no breakaway gear used. See FWC for specifics on gear requirements. It's not uncommon for law enforcement to be on the water during Tarpon Season.

Harbor fishing for Tarpon:

Live Ladyfish, Bait Busters, and large live whitebait are the food of choice. Size 6 – 8 hooks work well depending on the size of the bait. Make sure the hooks are really sharp.

Once the fish are located, set up a drift or go into anchor mode. Drift speed of .8 – 1.2 mph is ideal. Put the Ladyfish or Whitebait on a float, or dangle a Bait Buster (with or without a float). Set the floats at varying depths. Casting into the school works well too. Then wait for the bite and hold on.


Due to lack of oxygen in the water during the summer it's imperative to get the fish to the boat as quickly as possible for a safe release.



FISH OF THE MONTH – TARPON - CONTINUED

How to Locate Tarpon:

Do the obvious and look for a cluster of boats. Use Side Scan to locate the school. The picture below shows 2 schools of Tarpon on both sides of the boat.



Get ready for your heart rate to increase when this is on your screen and get ready for a bite

Look for them rolling or finning.

Protocol Tarpon Fishing:

Don't speed through boats Tarpon fishing; keep a lot of distance. When approaching a group of boats that are obviously Tarpon fishing, come off plane and slow to an idle 1/4 mile away.

It's ok to scan the area going slowly where there are boats likely fishing for Tarpon.

Give boats space when another boat has a fish on; make sure your boat doesn't interfere with them landing the fish. Keep in mind these fish can easily run 100+ yards. During a longer fight the captain may slowly bring the angler closer to the fish to preserve the health of the fish.

Safety:

Safety for both you and the fish are critical in tarpon fishing.

It is important that a tarpon is successfully released. When fishing for adult tarpon use a minimum of 40-pound line and 50# leader to keep the fight time down. Before releasing, ensure the tarpon is lively. If necessary, slowly pull though the water using either your trolling motor or outboard idling. Professional guides will hold the fish by the lower jaw when doing this (with a proper glove on). It's best for us amateurs to hold on to the leader or even cleat the leader. After reviving, cut the leader as close to the hook as possible. The fish should swim away strongly, not sink. Sometimes a fish can be stimulated by touching its tail with a rod tip.

Be aware that a Tarpon can easily jump in your boat or even jump up and hit you. There have been more than a few anglers hit in the head by a Tarpon jumping near the boat. When you have a fish near the boat try to lead it so it is not pointed directly at you. If a tarpon does jump in your boat it can be calmed by putting a wet towel over its eyes.

Good luck this month catching Tarpon and be safe (and keep the fish safe).



Tidbits


Less catches were reported again this month with pre-hurricane Hanna disrupting our fishing for nearly 5 days bringing much rain and stormy conditions as it drifted slowly west across our peninsula before forming and making landfall in Texas. The FOM – Shark – proved to be elusive, bending the rods of only 4 anglers. The Fitzgerald's continued to dominate the redfish and Rich Kale's 42" snook took over 1st place in the MAT. Seatrout continued to cooperate with continued 18"+ fish being reported – a good sign the release of this species is having good results. There were 5 changes in the MAT and 1 change in the Isles Trophy. 7 anglers achieved a new rung on their LOA including Donna Sullivan who attained her official GMA status as #51 in the club and Rick Sarkisian who earned his fourth GMA Star. Joe Udwari has amassed a total of 4900 points already this season, on his way to best his 2018 total of 6600 points.

HELP US TO HELP YOU

What is Punta Gorda Isles Marine Watch ("PGI Marine Watch")?

PGI Marine Watch is a volunteer on-the-water and land surveillance program like no other in Southwest Florida. The program was founded over ten years ago by Bill Guenther, a PGI resident, when he identified a need for increased security in the canals because of the increasing number of homes being built and residents moving to Punta Gorda Isles. Our group works in conjunction with the Punta Gorda Police Department, as a watch and report program. We act as a deterrent to those individuals who may be considering the theft of a boat or other



marine equipment, as well as illegal netting activity. Since its inception in 2009, the PGI Marine Watch has been an active part of reducing marine crime in Punta Gorda Isles.



What do our members do?

The volunteer members of the PGI Marine Watch use their own boats to patrol once a month for a two hour period. Some of our members partner with another PGI Marine Watch member and complete their patrol together, alternating boats. Some of our members patrol with a friend or their spouse. The patrol dates are flexible to fit your schedule and once your patrol is complete you email your report for the program records.

What is required to volunteer with the PGI Marine Watch?

The only requirement to volunteer with the PGI Marine Watch is a desire to help your community. The PGI Marine Watch program provides you with signage for your boat and works with you to determine which patrol area works best for you based upon where you reside. The preferred boat size is at least 19 feet in length due to the occasional rough waters in Charlotte Harbor, with either a T-top or bow rail to display the "PGI Marine Watch" sign. Our PGI Marine Watch volunteers also are authorized to receive a 5% fuel discount at Fisherman's Village Marine.


