PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB RANDY'S FISHING REPORT

August storms presented many challenges to getting out safely. The rains have further darkened the water but fish are still being caught! Trout reports are excellent...even close by along the East Wall. Big numbers being caught out in Pine Island Sound if you want to travel further. The water down there is beautiful; kept that way by nearby gulf water surging in and out. Fishing pressure is relatively low. Couple that with the closed trout season and I've definitely seen larger trout and more numbers. September Fish of the Month is Sea Trout: For more information on trout fishing, look at the "Fishing Events" section of this month's newsletter where we provide a tutorial with a few tips.

Tarpon fishing has been a bit tough lately. But they are still around the holes and 41 spans for another couple of months. Many reports of success on "canal sized" tarpon rolling in our neighborhoods.

Snook are still a solid choice for targeting. Artificial (shad rap style baits) as well as live white bait are doing well. Again, the closed season is proving a wise move for the recreational fisherman.

Getting a surprising amount of intel on redfish using top water plugs. That is a very fun technique! Backwaters along East Wall and many reports in the Matlacha Bay Area back waters are doing good. A great sign of health in the redfish fishery is that canal redfish are being caught again.

Mangrove snapper and Spanish mackerel are plentiful now. With a 10" minimum on the mangroves; that's the quickest way to a fish fry. Almost ANY structure (including sea walls and dock pilings are producing mangroves (and black drums). Use chunked up fresh shrimp (live or dead). For Spanish, try trolling large chrome rattletraps along East or west wall on the harbor-side of the sand bars in 5-7 foot of water.

Offshore has been tricky due to storms but Red Grouper, Gags, Porgies and some Permit are being caught. Wrecks & reefs near-shore and ledges out 60-75 feet seem to be doing well. The overnight boys are also doing well WAY OUT if you can get a couple of nice days. Grey Triggerfish season opens September 1st (closes October 24th).


We've had a very long stretch of Red-Tide free reports. Hopefully, the ugly stretch that began 2 years ago is past us for a while.

The Club is hosting a Fishing Seminar on Saturday, October 10th at 10am at the PGICA Auditorium. Signup begins on September 1st on the new PGICA Website calendar. FISH OF THE MONTH - SPOTTED SEATROUT



SPOTTED SEATROUT (Cynoscion nebulosus)

- Measured from tip of closed mouth to end of pinched tail
- They have small black spots on top with a whitish under belly
- Currently catch and release only
- State record -39.5" and 17lb7oz – caught on a topwater Zara Spook Plug in 1995 on the East Coast
- Club record 29" caught by Rich Brennan in 2009 and Aaron Wagner tied the catch in 2012

- · Fish are here all year round
- They school with similar size trout
- Generally found on or near grass flats in 2 – 4 feet of water; some of the larger fish may sit in a deeper hole nearby grass flats
- Popping Cork tied to braid and a leader with an artificial shrimp, jig head with soft plastic, and/or live bait (including shrimp) work well

FISH OF THE MONTH - SPOTTED SEATROUT 101

Where to Find Spotted Seatrout and Conditions

Locate healthy grass beds in 2.5-3.5 feet of water NEAR DEEP WATER. Trout have to have an exit plan when they are being chased around by dolphins and sharks. The nearby deep water gives them comfort feed and hang around, and an exit plan during predator drive-by's. Turtle grass is the preferred grass species to fish although they prefer spawning in the "string-grass" which is sometimes mixed in with the turtle grass; so, both can be productive for catching.

Trout are active and feeding in moving water. A slow incoming tide is preferred. Heavy fast tides tend to stir up bottom debris, cloud up the water, and tend to suspend debris up into your lure. A rising tide is also safer in unfamiliar areas since you will have more water if you lose track of time. As long as the water is moving, you're in good shape. Two ways to discern moving water (besides your tide tables); look down at the grass and ensure the long tips are "bent over". Secondly look at the shaft of your trolling motor where it enters the water for indication of flow.

Like most fish species, they eat MUCH better when barometric pressure is low or dropping...like a few hours before a front moves in. With our long summers we get very few fronts, so the next best thing to help guide you on better days (and times) are the Solunar Tables. They will generally steer you to fish around full moons or new moons; some people prefer new-moon fishing days since the trout feed all night on full-moon days... They may not be hungry come sun up after feeding all night long.

Tackle:

A 7' medium action spinning rod works well with a quality 2500 or 3000 series sized reel. Use 15 - 20# braid with a popping cork and 20-25# fluorocarbon leader line. If using lures, a "clear red glitter" 3" DOA shrimp or a white or pearl paddle tail works well; pearl and white work better in summer months. Chose a jig head that's 1/16 oz - 1/8 oz; consider using a weed less jig head. Cajun and Black Bay Thunder popping corks have worked well.

When tying your popping cork to your leader, remember the gold beads are on the bottom and the part with the colored beads are tied to the braid.



FISH OF THE MONTH – SPOTTED SEATROUT 101



DOA Shrimp "red clear glitter shrimp", Pearl soft plastic and weed less jig head



Technique:

Set up your leader at 18-24" long. That'll allow the lure to dance just at the grass tips. Try to always tie a loop knot at your jig head (or DOA shrimp). That helps its action and allows it to dance a bit better. Trout almost exclusively strike at bait ABOVE them...Usually from being bedded in the grass. That's what makes popping corks so efficient. Make long casts and retrieve slowly with repetitive strong pops of your cork. Vary the popping action but don't be afraid to pop it hard; enough to spray water a bit. The cork is designed to "clack" when jerked. This simulates distressed bait fish (a huge advantage over other techniques).

Live Bait:

Shrimp and White Bait can produce good results for Seatrout. Shrimp can be rigged under a popping cork. White Bait should be freelined; in shallow water use a float so the bait swims just above the grass. In deeper water a float may not be needed depending on the amount of grass.

FISH OF THE MONTH – SPOTTED SEATROUT 101

Tips:

- Trout hate direct sunlight, so fish with a slight breeze to break up slick water. If the
 breeze is too much...then it's very difficult to see and finesse your cork. You can fish
 successfully on windy days, but search out protected areas that have a ripple in the
 water.
- A corollary to the first tip is to "fish the slick". In breezy conditions, a ribbon slick is often
 formed and may remain for many minutes at a time. If you're close enough, concentrate
 on fishing the edges of the slick. Trout love to hover under the ripple edge and ambush
 bait swimming through the slick (easily detected and captured).
- 3. When fishing small grass beds, you'll have better luck positioning yourself on the windward side of the grass bed. This is the side that will tend to wash up bait for them to feed on.
- 4. Don't be afraid to move frequently, even on the same grass bed; 20 feet makes a big difference at times.
- 5. The harbor and surroundings have multiple tide times. So, to prevent being forced to fish through a slack tide, plan your trip spots to always catch moving water.
- 6. A good popping cork can "call in" fish 50' away. So be patient when you first arrive at a spot. Give the cork a few casts to get them in your area.
- 7. Don't be afraid to cast over the edge of the grass beds into the trough or channel (recall that you should pick a grass bed NEAR deep water). At times, the bigger trout hang there.
- 8. Keep an eye on your leader line condition. Chaffed line is not only weaker, but as important is that the chaff is easily visible to the trout.
- 9. A rule-of-thumb is when you're catching a bunch of Ladyfish, then you're fishing a grass bed that's too deep.
- 10. QUIET! When nearing your waypoint, stop the big engine and quietly troll into position. Don't slam hatch covers or jump down from casting decks. Some people even turn off their sonar once anchored (power poled).





PUNTA GORDA ISLES MARINE WATCH HELP US TO HELP YOU



What is Punta Gorda Isles Marine Watch ("PGI Marine Watch")?

PGI Marine Watch is a volunteer on-the-water and land surveillance program like no other in Southwest Florida. The program was founded over ten years ago by Bill Guenther, a PGI resident, when he identified a need for increased security in the canals because of the increasing number of homes being built and residents moving to Punta Gorda Isles. Our group works in conjunction with the Punta Gorda Police Department, as a watch and report program. We act as a deterrent to those individuals who may be considering the theft of a boat or other



marine equipment, as well as illegal netting activity. Since its inception in 2009, the PGI Marine Watch has been an active part of reducing marine crime in Punta Gorda Isles.




What do our members do?

The volunteer members of the PGI Marine Watch use their own boats to patrol once a month for a two hour period. Some of our members partner with another PGI Marine Watch member and complete their patrol together, alternating boats. Some of our members patrol with a friend or their spouse. The patrol dates are flexible to fit your schedule and once your patrol is complete you email your report for the program records.

What is required to volunteer with the PGI Marine Watch?

The only requirement to volunteer with the PGI Marine Watch is a desire to help your community. The PGI Marine Watch program provides you with signage for your boat and works with you to determine which patrol area works best for you based upon where you reside. The preferred boat size is at least 19 feet in length due to the occasional rough waters in Charlotte Harbor, with either a T-top or bow rail to display the "PGI Marine Watch" sign. Our PGI Marine Watch volunteers also are authorized to receive a 5% fuel discount at Fisherman's Village Marine.




