Hello again friends,

This edition of the newsletter will look different. We're combining July and August into one edition, and we chose to change it up with a series of short tutorials on a few summer sought-after species. And if you missed the June meeting, I'm going to revisit and include a small article on preparing your boat lift and boat for a heavy storm.

A few comments on changing FWC regulations: starting July 1st, Cobia minimum fork length changes to 36" (versus the old 33"). The Fishing Club has revised the "points spread" for Cobia up for each interval (100 points is 37", 200 points for a 40" Cobia and 300 points for a 43" fish). Snook and redfish remain catch and release for now but there are plans to re-open redfish harvest back to one per person but only two per vessel. Also changing...Charter Captains will no longer be allowed to "gift" their limit to the customers. WHEN these redfish changes go into effect remains unclear. Another positive change is that the redfish management "zones" are going from 3 to 9 with Charlotte Harbor forming its own zone. That should lead to more custom management for us.

Red tide, while not yet in the harbor, is in the area. Some red tide is being detected south of us in Lee and Collier counties, and evidence of minor fish kills are being reported. I haven't seen or smelled it yet here.

Offshore has been popular since the red snapper season opened, but I'm told that they are FAR out (around 160') and with the boat-gas prices, many are sticking with red grouper.

Please consider helping out on the Board of Directors next year. We formed a Nominating Committee to put structure in the searches but get involved! Let me know if you're interested. The pay and benefits are awesome!




Month in Review (June 2022)

Tidbits

Our Fish of the Month, Jack Crevalle, were reported by 13 anglers totaling 16 fish up to 27.5". Seatrout remained a reliable quarry with 21 catches submitted. A few tarpon (5) were reported as well. Several large Black Drum (10) were caught in our canals saving a lot of high-priced boat fuel. The largest of these were monsters caught by the husband-and-wife team of Mike and Christine White at 52" and 51" with Christine's larger fish setting a new club record, beating her husband's old record by ½ inch. Jude Panetta earned his fourth GMA Star, becoming the 6th angler to earn a star this year so far. Mike Knipe earned both his Bronze and Silver Pins in the same month.

What is Punta Gorda Isles Marine Watch ("PGI Marine Watch")?

PGI Marine Watch is a volunteer on-the-water and land surveillance program like no other in Southwest Florida. The program was founded over ten years ago by Bill Guenther, a PGI resident, when he identified a need for increased security in the canals because of the increasing number of homes being built and residents moving to Punta Gorda Isles. Our group works in conjunction with the Punta Gorda Police Department, as a watch and report program. We act as a deterrent to those individuals who may be considering the theft of a boat or other



marine equipment, as well as illegal netting activity. Since its inception in 2009, the PGI Marine Watch has been an active part of reducing marine crime in Punta Gorda Isles.




What do our members do?

The volunteer members of the PGI Marine Watch use their own boats to patrol once a month for a two hour period. Some of our members partner with another PGI Marine Watch member and complete their patrol together, alternating boats. Some of our members patrol with a friend or their spouse. The patrol dates are flexible to fit your schedule and once your patrol is complete you email your report for the program records.

What is required to volunteer with the PGI Marine Watch?

The only requirement to volunteer with the PGI Marine Watch is a desire to help your community. The PGI Marine Watch program provides you with signage for your boat and works with you to determine which patrol area works best for you based upon where you reside. The preferred boat size is at least 19 feet in length due to the occasional rough waters in Charlotte Harbor, with either a T-top or bow rail to display the "PGI Marine Watch" sign. Our PGI Marine Watch volunteers also are authorized to receive a 5% fuel discount at Fisherman's Village Marine.

PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB TROUT - TACKLE

The summer is a great season for trout fishing! So, let's take a few minutes and go over details that can increase your chances at success. I'll cover basics as well as a few tips for experienced members too.

TACKLE

My favorite rod and reel are a 7' medium action spinning rod with a quality 2500 or 3000 series sized reel. I use 15# braid with a popping cork and 20-25# fluorocarbon leader line. Terminal tackle is usually a 3" DOA shrimp or a paddle-tail lure on a 1/16 oz or up to an 1/8 oz jig head. My two favorite colors are "clear red glitter" and white (or pearl). The red glitter is year-round while the white is better in the summer months. My favorite popping corks are the "Cajun Thunder" brand (egg-shaped style).

For trout to be active, they have to have moving water. I prefer a slow rising tide. The heavy fast tides tend to stir up bottom debris and cloud up the water or worse; suspend debris up into your lure. A rising tide is also safer in unfamiliar areas since you will have more water if you lose track of time. But as long as the water is moving, you're in good shape. Two ways to discern moving water (besides your tide tables): Look down at the grass and ensure the long tips are "bent over" and secondly, look at the shaft of your trolling mother where it enters the water for indication of flow.

Like most fish species, they bite MUCH better when barometric pressure is low or dropping...like a few hours before a front moves in. But in our long summers, we get very few fronts, so the next best thing to help guide you on better days (and times) are the solunar tables. They will generally steer you to fish around full moons or new moons BUT I prefer new-moon fishing days since the trout feed all night on full-moon days...making them a bit too satisfied at sun-up.

Locate healthy grass beds in 2.5-3.5 feet of water NEAR DEEP WATER. Trout have to have an exit plan when they are being chased around by dolphins and sharks. The nearby deep water gives them comfort enough to hang around during predator drive-by's. Turtle grass is my favorite grass species to fish although they prefer spawning in the "string-grass" which is sometimes mixed in with the turtle grass.



PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB TROUT - TECHNIQUE

TECHNIQUE

Set up your leader at 18-24" long. That'll allow the lure to dance just at the grass tips. Try to always tie a loop knot at your jig head (or DOA shrimp). That helps its action and allows it to dance a bit better. Trout almost exclusively strike at bait ABOVE them...usually from being bedded in the grass. That's what makes popping corks so efficient. Make long casts and retrieve slowly with repetitive strong pops of your cork. Vary the popping action but don't be afraid to pop it hard...enough to spray water a bit. The cork is designed to "clack" when jerked. This simulates distressed bait fish (a huge advantage over other techniques).



PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB TROUT - TIPS

TIPS



1) Trout hate direct sunlight. So, I like to fish with a slight breeze to break up slick water. If the breeze is too much...then it's very difficult to see and finesse your cork. You can fish successfully on windy days but search out protected areas that have a ripple in the water.

2) A corollary to the first tip is to "fish the slick". In breezy conditions, a ribbon slick is often formed and may remain for many minutes at a time. If you're close enough, concentrate on fishing the edges of the slick. Trout love to hover under the ripple edge and ambush bait swimming through the slick (easily detected and captured).

3) When fishing small grass beds, you'll have better luck positioning yourself on the windward side of the grass bed. This is the side that will tend to wash up bait for them to feed on.

4) Don't be afraid to move frequently, even on the same grass bed. 20 feet makes a big difference at times.

5) The harbor and surroundings have multiple tide times. So, to prevent being forced to fish through a slack tide, plan your trip spots to always catch moving water.

6) A good popping cork ("clacker" as we call them in Louisiana) can "call in" fish 50' away. So be patient when you first arrive at a spot. Give the cork a few casts to get them in your area.

7) Don't be afraid to cast over the edge of the grassbeds into the trough or channel (recall that you should pick a grass bed NEAR deep water). At times, the bigger trout hang there.


8) Keep an eye on your leader line condition. Chaffed line is not only weaker, but as important is that the chaff is easily visible to the trout.

9) A rule-of-thumb is when you're catching a bunch of Ladyfish, then you're fishing a grassbed that's too deep.

10) QUIET! When nearing your waypoint, stop the big engine and quietly troll into position. Don't slam hatch covers or jump down from casting decks. Some friends of mine even turn off their sonar once anchored (power poled).

The Red Tide closure has been effective for the population and size, but fish handling is still important. And to prevent dolphins from stealing your throwbacks, try to release them UNDERWATER. The dolphins "wait" for the splash...if there is none, then the fish has a chance. ENJOY. See you out there!!





TARPON - TACKLE

Standard "tarpon rod"

- > 8' spinning rod
 - Shimano Teramar TMS-X80XH (\$129)
- > 5000-10000 reel
 - Daiwa BG5000 (\$120)
 - Quantum Cabo 60 (\$200)
- > 50 to 65# braid
 - DO NOT use less than 50#
- > 6' of 60 or 80# fluorocarbon leader
 - Note: Your "grouper rod" will work with ladyfish or BaitBuster danglers IF it has a good drag and min 65 # braid

Knots

- > Spider hitch or Bimini Twist to double the braid
- > Albright, FG or Double Uni for braid to leader
- > Loop knot for Bait Buster

Rig

- > Keep hook sharp!
- > Loop knot
- > 4 to 6' leader 60 or 80 lb.

Standard tarpon rod

- > 6' to 8' leader 80# fluorocarbon
- > 8/0 or 9/0 circle hook (Trokar Lancet offset CK3 or offset TK3)
- Hook live ladyfish thru mouth and nostril
 - > Catch trolling in 3-5'
 - > Walmart crappie jigs or small spoons
- Drift behind boat
 - > Trolling motor control best
 - > One or two rods (float w/ two)
 - > 30' to 100' back
- Watch for rolling fish
- Rod in holder
 - > No free spool
 - > No hookset
 - > Bow to the silver king



PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB HARBOR ETIQUETTE

- Tarpon are easily "put down" by boats.
- Do not run your outboard any closer than ¼ mile from a group of boats fishing for tarpon.
- Only enter a group of boats fishing for tarpon with your trolling motor. (If you don't have a trolling motor, stay outside "the pack." Tarpon schools in the harbor are large and scattered so you don't need to be in the middle of the group.)
- Unless invited, stay 100 yards away from other boats.
- Do not block the drift of other boats.



BLACK COULDL (Pigersian chosen)

Introduction:

Targeting big Black Drum in mid to late summer will yield fun and productive catches! Black Drum are a LOA species, a points fish and hanging out in our backyard in the summer.

The Black Drum school up by the hundreds in the PGI canals, are easy to find, catch, and lot of fun.



Gear – terminal tackle:

Drum don't require heavy or special gear like Tarpon and Shark. A 6-14 or 8-17 rod that's 7' -7'6" paired with a 3000 reel is ideal. 15lb or 20lb braid and 20lb 3 - 4' leader will get the job done. For terminal tackle; a 1/16 - 1/8 jig head with a strong hook and a 4" Berkley Gulp white swimming mullet or Berkley Shrimp. DOA TerrorEyz have also produced good results. Any soft plastic will likely work; try the soft plastics you have before buying anything new. Putting some scent on the soft plastics seems to get more hook-ups.



Live bait isn't the bait of choice for Black Drum in the summer. We caught snapper and catfish when using live bait while on the school.

Location/timing:

Finding schools is key.

The last few years they have been schooled in the canals late July through the **first** cold front in October. Tide doesn't seem to matter, the morning hours until 1:00pm or so have been most productive. They tend to school up in the canals the same time Tarpon move to the harbor/rivers. They gravitate near larger bodies of water at intersecting canals. They move around from area to area.

<u>Ponce Inlet</u>: come in through Ponce and check the larger bodies of water on the left (Sea Trout Strait) and several hundred feet of the interesting canals.



<u>Bass Inlet</u>: from Fisherman's Village go under the bridge and turn left at the "lighthouse". Go down to the third canal on your left.







How to find the Drum:

Set Side-scan at 80' and do search patterns. The schools are easy to find. If you don't have side-scan, think about partnering with another boat that does to scout for the school.

This image shows the drum are heavily concentrated behind the boat. The drum are on both sides behind the boat, more fish on the right side out to 60', there are many fish on the left side, and the fish are on the move.



This image shows the drum are directly below the boat and heavily concentrated on the left. There are some on the right side, but not as many.



In the absence of side scan look for disturbances on the top of the water and the water color to be darker. The school frequently stir up the bottom but can be hard to see in the summer with the darkness of the water.



Technique/bite:

A **very** slow retrieve will produce hook ups. When you get a bite let the fish take it, set the hook, the fish will immediately make a run. Hold on and enjoy the fight.

Slow down the retrieve if you are on the school and haven't hooked up! The retrieve is VERY slow, it's so slow you feel your lure skimming over the school or dragging on the bottom.

Etiquette:

It's common for a few boats to be fishing the same school. There's plenty of fish for everyone. They don't scatter when a boat approaches like other species. Some of the best results are when boats are working together to track the school. There have been up to four boats fishing the same school and each boat hooking up. It's great fun to see that.




Considerations:

- Plan to revive the fish when using light gear and the high-water temperatures. Proper fish handling is critical given the temperatures and low oxygen level in the water. Bring multiple plastic fish grabbers to revive more than one fish at time. - Heavier gear is ok to bring the fish in faster; use what you have.
- The school will move a few hundred feet when a fish is hooked; keep looking for the school for the next opportunity to hook up. This is when multiple boats fishing the same school can be more productive; by the time you revived the fish the other boat(s) many have relocated the school.
- Provide feedback to the fishing club on your experiences so we can keep information on the topic up to date.

PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB SNOOK – LOCATIONS & CONDITIONS

Snook are temperature limited in their range, becoming very lethargic in the winter and are limited to regions where water temperature is greater than 60F year-round, i.e. Southern Florida. Also, Snook are able to move between fresh and salt water, so can be found upstream in the Peace and Myakka rivers, in the brackish waters of Charlotte Harbor, and in the Gulf on near shore reefs. Snook are ambush predators waiting for prey fish to come to them. I search out areas where water movement is high (which brings the prey fish in range) where they can hide waiting to ambush. These areas are primarily eddy's created by obstructions in fast water movement behind supports under bridges and docks, or ledges washed over by waves on flats of the East Wall (that area on the East side of the harbor). In backwater slower moving water areas, e.g. the islands of the East Wall, Turtle Bay, Bull Bay, or Placida Sound, they hide in shady spots under low overhanging mangrove branches, particularly at leading or trailing points of islands or inner bays. The Peace and Myakka rivers are great in the Winter when rainfall is limited due to fast running water. However, limited in the Summer due to daily rain that causes tannin's and silt to leach into the water, limiting site distance and creating difficult fishing conditions for snook.



PUNTA GORDA ISLES FISHING CLUB SNOOK – BAIT FISH

Snook primarily (70%) feed on small fish, commonly known to anglers as white bait, consisting of pinfish, scaled sardines (green backs), and threadfin herring among others. They will also feed on shrimp year-round but primarily when small fish are scarce.

Snook can be caught by using lures that look or act like bait fish, or by using bait fish directly. Lures commonly used are paddle tails (swim bait) affixed to a jig head. Popular among these are Berkely Gulp, Strike King, D.O.A. "Electric Chicken", Z-man slam shady. These all work great but require some practice to create an action the triggers the snook to bite.

Alternatively, using live bait does not require practice to use effectively but does require some skill to catch the bait. Catching white bait can be accomplished using a sabiki rig (a string of small hooks on a line with a weight on the end), or with a cast net. There are 2 primary kinds of cast nets, those thrown on shallow water flats (1' to 4') and those thrown in deep water (4' to 20' radius). The usual mesh size for both is between 1/4" and 3/8". Flats nets are usually 1 pound per foot of radius or less, while deep water nets are 1.25 to 1.66 pounds per foot. Both range in size from 4' to 12' radius; the larger the size the more skill, strength, and balance required to throw. Both require the use of chum to lure the bait fish in range. Chum is a mixture of dried fish protein and oil. Sand is added for deep water repeatedly until the white bait show up at the surface. Chum is available at all local bait shops.

Common flats areas where white bait can be caught include the areas outside Pirates Harbor, Burnt Store, and Jug Creek Shoals outside Bokeelia. Common deep-water sites are channel markers 1 and 2 in Charlotte Harbor. The latter requires proper etiquette while throwing amongst other guides and fishermen, i.e., waiting your turn outside the marker until a "spot" opens up, know how to throw the net before you get there so your bait can be quickly caught and others can move in. Finally, a good live well is needed. These clog regularly in flats areas due to intake of grass by the pump, so keep an eye on.

Now that we're in hurricane season, it's time to review how to prepare your boat for a blow. There are many opinions and costly ways to do this, but I'm describing a cheap and simple, few steps to hedge your bets on boat survivorship. You'll need **two 3300# cargo straps**. These are the yellow, 2 or 3" wide straps with a ratchet (pictured below).



Also, four 5" stainless steel eyebolts.

And finally, a **couple of small cargo ratchet straps. These are the 1**" **orange-colored straps.** All of this is available at Tractor Supply on Kings Highway.

Follow these steps:

• Install the eyebolts into each of the four main boat lift pilings. If you have concrete pilings, then you'll need to wrap the straps into a choke knot around all four pilings. The eyebolts (two pics below) should be installed on the boat-side of all four pilings, about midway up between the dock level and the top of your pilings.



- Remove EVERYTHING in your boat that isn't strapped down.
- Ensure your batteries are fully charged and empty (pump out or drain) your bilge. If you drain it, make sure to replace the plug so the boat doesn't reverse flood during a surge.
- Ensure your fuel tank is FULL.

 Raise the boat lift ALMOST as far as it'll raise. Hook the yellow cargo straps to the eyebolts. One cargo strap forward and one aft. Try to provide a clear unobstructed path across your boat for the straps to lie. You may need to remove seats, ice chests or pads. Tighten the ratchets. No need to over tighten and hurt yourself or your boat gunnels! After the straps are secure, carefully raise the boat lift electrically to tighten everything up. This is typically only another inch or two. Don't allow the eyebolts to bend or warp with the force. If they easily deform, you may need heavier ones. On my boat lift, the eyebolts never deformed even with the lift tight up against the straps.

- Using the small orange straps, secure the boat lift carriage to the two aft or forward pilings by wrapping them. The intent here is to prevent any swing.
- The PRIORITY on the preparations is to prevent or limit all movement. Any bit of movement causes resonance with extreme winds. A sloshing bilge or fuel tank worsens the resonance. Movement causes mechanical damage, which is your most likely result even if the boat "survives". Many owners tie down their boats to the lift's carriage instead of the pilings. Not a good idea. The buoyancy of a typical boat will easily lift the whole carriage in the event of a surge...leading to damage as it bangs around.
- Take a photo of your "prepared" boat. It MAY come in handy with your insurance company.
- Finally, turn off power to your lift and dock.

These steps only help your boat make it through...they don't guarantee it. If we get "the big one" again, you'll have other worries.
