- 7. Speakers: Jim McCarty, Mike from Ingman, and Fishin Frank
 - Dr. McCarty stated that 16 people have taken the CPR/1st aid training and that kits are still available for \$30; contact Cathy Hunt if you are interested. As long as people are interested in training, he will continue to teach
 - Mike Brimer informed us that Ingman partners with the CCA, donating for local funds, helping with the restocking of nearby grasses; also, the money from the upcoming CCA banquet goes toward oyster bed restoration.
 - Fishin' Frank spoke on ways to catch snook. A few good takeaways: troll snook with rattle traps or the Rapalla XR10 at a depth of about 8-9' against the current at about 2 mph and with current 4 mph (in harbor); in canals, troll 3-5 mph best with 1 rod and 1 lure at a time, mounted on right side of boat where it can be seen, and on the shadow line. Snook have excellent hearing, smelling, and sight so going to a quiet place or at night is best so fish can hear the lure.

Interesting Tidbits



FISHING REPORT



The white butterflies have been around for several weeks and that's a sign the tarpon are here. Oh yeah. There have been reports of tarpon in the harbor as well as Boca Pass. Fishing for tarpon in Boca Pass is not for the faint of heart; it's combat fishing. Last May I decided I wanted to learn to fish the Pass for tarpon. I have always been intimidated to fish for tarpon in the pass as there can be 40 boats within 5 feet of each other, and questioned my ability to maneuver the boat in such close proximity. I decided my best bet was to hire a local well-known guide to teach me the ropes. He set the plan and we were in the pass before dawn. He set up the short drift, we put the crabs on a 7/0 circle hook attached to an 8' leader with 2 ounces of lead and dropped to the bottom. In a matter of minutes, we were hooked up as well as 6 boats around us. What could go wrong with 6 boats hooked up within 5' of each other fighting the silver king in the dark..... You can imagine it was a shit show, but a successful one. Boats were handing off rods to get the lines uncrossed and getting the right rod back to the boat to continue fighting the fish, boats with fish on were trying to get out of the herd of boats, and boats not hooked up were in full awareness of their surroundings making room for boats to get out of the herd. The only reason it was successful was due to the skill and experience of the captains. After that experience I decided to leave tarpon pass fishing to the professionals. I'll wait for them to come into the harbor.

Be familiar with FWC rules and regulations for fishing Boca Pass April, May and June. Regardless of species targeted only 3 lines can be out per boat; there are several more regulations to know.

Hill Tides will be here soon. Hill Tides are when the outgoing tide is so strong it flushes the crabs out of the grass and into the pass (hence the tarpon are here to feed). It occurs 2 days before and after the new and full moon and lasts until July. It can be fun to bring a crab net along that time of year to try to get a few crabs; makes for great Cobia and Redfish bait.

FISHING REPORT



Spanish Mackerel – they have been on the move and biting on spoons when the tide is moving, trolling speed of 4.8 – 5.5 mph in ~6 feet. Even using a swivel there can/will be line twists. They have been coming and going from marker 5 to Cape Haze, Bokeelia bar, and Jug Creek Shoal. By middle of April, they will make their way up harbor and by late April/May will be in rivers too.

Sheepshead – the season is ending soon. However, for the Great Catch Tournament mid-March there were some nice ones caught by the phosphate docks. There were several points Sheepshead caught and turned in.

White bait — it's here. Get the cast nets out and start practicing. Having white bait will certainly increase the number and size of fish caught. If you don't know how to throw a net, stop by **Fishin Franks** for some education. It'll be worth your time. The biggest question will be how many nets does one need to buy? I don't think one is enough.... Captain Teds Tackle and Fishin Franks has the best selection of cast nets at the moment; I was at both places late March and prefer to buy local. If you stop by their shops, thank them for advertising with our club.
















Fish of the Month For APRIL

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait



Fish of the Month - Snook

Identification:

- Large mouth, lower jaw extends to the eye
- Split dorsal fish
- Black lateral line to the tail



Technique:

- Fishin Frank gave an in-depth talk on how and where to catch Snook trolling in our March meeting.
- Fishing Fish Lights: This time of year, many people fish the "lights" at night. By fishing the
 light, you are really fishing the dark area outside the light not casting directly into the light.
 Baits that work well: very large shrimp, small Rapala count down lure, white bait, and small
 Wild Eyed Storm Shads. Cast under the dock and to the sides of the light, in the dark area.
 The snook don't bite in the bright of the light, but will follow your lure.
 - If you hook someone's light, be polite and cut your line immediately. Don't retrieve their light to save your line.
 - Club members that don't have a fish light should get one. Go to Underwater Fish Lights in Port Charlotte; they make the best lights, offer a discount to members, advertise with our club, and are local.
- Big baits equal big fish. White bait, ladyfish, and mullet have yielded some large catches.
 Plan accordingly for gear choices.

Club record:

- March 2023 Mike White killed the club record catching a 49" snook from his dock. I think he
 used a large live bait.
- The previous club record was a 45" tie between Vinnie Madsen in 2014 and Tim Gibbons 2021. I believe Tim caught his large snook on a ladyfish while tarpon fishing.
- · The theme seems to be: big bait, big fish...
