FISHING REPORT



Summer time is in full swing. Well almost, we are missing the great thunderstorms rolling through our area later afternoons, but the storms should come shortly.

A reminder from our club recorded keeper Paul Whiting: Fish of the Month (FOM) for July is shark and August is tarpon. The Fish of the Month rules for these months are different from other months; our Fish of the Month contests for July and August involve a points system to determine the overall winners rather than simply the longest single fish reported.

FOM shark and tarpon awards will be based on the total number of points accumulated for these species caught in their respective award months: 1st place for the most points, 2nd place for the second most points and 3rd place for the third most points. Any shark or tarpon estimated to be 5 feet or longer to the fork is awarded 3 points, whereas any smaller fish will only be awarded 1 point. Club members can only win one award per contest.

Both shark and tarpon must be estimated to the overall fork-length and the angler, for safety reasons, does NOT need to be in the photo of the fish. We encourage a photo of the complete fish in the water at boatside to allow for immediate release.

- Members are encouraged to submit multiple catches of the Fish of the Month to accumulate the greatest number of points during the respective months.

FISHING REPORT



Off-shore reports have been minimal, but a few members have braved the heat and gone out for red snapper with mixed results. Those going to 165'+ have had some success if the weather didn't chase them closer in. Red Grouper closing July 21, 2023 will likely result in fewer off-shore reports.

Check out the 2022 July/August newsletter for specifics on catching sea trout, tarpon, black drum, and snook in the summer. Note locations change, but most of the other information is the same. Thanks to Mike White for providing expertise on how to troll for sharks, catch spadefish, and catching mangrove snapper in Boca Pass that are in this newsletter. Spadefish are a species often overlooked in the summer but are fun to catch.

Tips for Summer Species JULY and AUGUST

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

Spade Fish


Spade Fish Introduction:

Spadefish are a summer species not often targeted but should be. They school in large numbers for several months in the summer. They definitely bend the rod and give a good fight with their wide bodies and broad tail action; plus are excellent table fare for those looking for a meal. Hopefully these tips will help get the fish hooked vs feeding the fish.

This is a great species to target when fishing with friends and family for a fun casual day on the water. An added bonus is that these fish are easy to fillet.

Identification:

- Silver color with 4 to 6 black vertical bars on each side (may fade in larger fish)
- Wide body with broad tail
- First and second dorsal fins separated
- Tail-shape concave and broad
- Second dorsal fin and anal fin
- Young are entirely dark brown or black in color



Locations/behavior:

- Structure is the key; Alligator reef, Fisherman's Village docks, Danger reef, Tremblay's reef, Mary's reef you get the point. Don't go too deep looking for them.
- This schooling fish tends to meander in areas. They hang out slowly swimming around in various water columns, never sit still; the key is they hang out in the same area.
- They aren't aggressive swimmers or eaters; they appear lackadaisical.
- They eat crustations (shrimp) and jellyfish

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

Spade Fish, Continued

Rigging:

- Light tackle is desired, a regular rod for snapper or trout and a 2,000 3,000 reel works well.
- 10 20lb braid and maximum of 20lb fluorocarbon, with a 5' or longer leader.
- A small bobber/float; something in the ¾" range. Consider using a slip float with a float stopper when fishing deeper water to adjust the depth of your bobber to target the specific water columns. If fishing in the harbor likely you can get by without a float stopper.
- In the harbor, you'll likely be setting your float 5' 8' from the hook.
- A small strong hook is needed with a short shank. Ideally the hook is about ½" in diameter, very short shank, and strong. These fish crush through shells; a strong hook is needed.
 - They have a lot of fight in them once hooked and will flatten many hooks.
- Small split shot 18" 24" above the hook; adjust the size of split shot based on current.
 - Your bait will now flow more naturally with the current.
- Use a small shrimp; live or recently live, no larger than a dime. In the summer months the shrimp are small, and that works well for this species. The shrimp should cover the hook and the shank, with no excess shrimp on the hook. Don't use a "mussy" shrimp; those can be easily torn off the hook; the shrimp needs to be firm. Also try removing the shell of the shrimp.

The bite:

- The bite is very subtle. It's not like a cobia or tarpon, or even a snapper. You may think bait fish are nibbling, but if you know there are Spadefish in the area it's not baitfish.
- Watch for the bobber/float to go down a little and set the hook!
- Failure to set the hook will result in feeding the fish.
- Do not use a large float as the bite is subtle and a larger float won't yield the same results.

Technique:

- Anchor up over the area of the school. You can visually see the school in the water and they show up on bottom scan and side scan. On bottom scan they show up as small arcs in various water columns.
- Cast or drop to the water column where the fish are. Let the bait sit there. Don't reel, don't jerk it, let the fish find the shrimp. Once you see the float go down, set the hook.
- The fish don't get scared when using spot lock over the school.

Trolling for Shark

Introduction to trolling for shark:

Sharks are cruising the harbor and lower rivers in the summer. They are a good species to target if you have patience and the strength to fight and land the big ones in our area. This technique focuses on trolling live ladyfish.

Identification:

They range in length and specific markings. Generally, they are all greyish in color and have very sharp teeth that want to mess you up when you hook and land one

Locations/behavior:

- "Clean" side of tide lines; they will be taking cover and looking for bait flowing through.
- Start at marker 2 towards marker 1, stay outside the tire reef on the way to marker 1. Hang a right towards marker 7 in the Myakka River. Stay in the deeper water.
- On an out-going tide go to the west side of Alligator Reef to the west wall/marker 5 area. Stay in the deeper water and look for the tide line.
- Outside the bars on east and west wall; in 6 to 8' of water.
- Shoals by Two Pines.
- Deeper water near "the hill".
- Aggressive feeders, feed based on scent, fast swimmers.
- They will follow the scent to find the bait.

Rigging:

- Long 8' or so of leader 80 100lb; monofilament or fluorocarbon. Tie the leader to the braid.
- 1' 3' wire leader (Tooth Proof 100 lb) with a swivel at one end and a 8-12 inline circle hook to the other end. Use a haywire twist knot when making your wire leader. Don't make the wire leader too long as you need to grab the line to unhook the fish.
- Tie the leader to the barrel swivel that is on the wire leader.
- A large float (so you can see where your bait is).
- Rig the ladyfish through the nostril and lip or "bridle" through the eyes. Bridling through the eyes can
 yield great success as the ladyfish will not be as active when the shark is nearby and the bait won't get
 caught up in other lines when trolling more than 1 line.

Technique:

- This is a slow controlled troll with a trolling motor. Ideal speed is .8 mph. Can also try drifting.
- Troll against the current.
- Keep the extra live ladyfish in the livewell. The water circulating in the well goes into the water providing scent to the shark; it acts as chum.

Trolling for Shark, continued

Technique (continued):

- The bait should be ~150' behind the boat.
- The combination of the ladyfish in the livewell, going against the current, and the bait far behind the boat is key; the scent is permeating the water.
- If trolling more than 1 live bait, use extension arms if you have them to keep the baits as far away from each other as possible. Also stagger the baits at least 20' apart behind the boat; 1 bait at 140' and the other at 160'. That will reduce the fish getting tangled.
- Trolling the weed line of the tide will result in the lines getting tangled; troll the clear side. The shark tend to be on the dirty side waiting for bait to go by.

The bite:

- Hard, strong, and get ready for the drag to peel off the reel.
- Get other rods reeled in and stowed for the fight.
- It's hard to miss a shark (or other large fish) that take your bait.

Safety:

- Release the shark as soon as possible.
- Don't boat the shark; even the small ones. A picture of the shark in the water with estimated fork length is all that is needed for Ladder of Achievements and Fish of the Month.
- Always have a good pair of protective gloves on board to grab the leader.
- Do not wrap the leader around your hand.
- Have a good pair of long handled wire/hook cutters and dehooking device.
- Always best to fish with a partner.
- Large sharks are known to get pissed after getting hooked, just ask long time club member Joe Udwari about the shark that bit the back of his boat after landing it. It did a number on his fiberglass.
- Have good first-aid supplies on boat just in case; a good tourniquet at the least.

Mangrove Snapper in Boca Pass

Introduction to catching Mangrove Snapper in the pass:

After the large schools of tarpon leave the pass is a good time to target the snappers. Likely there will also be some good dolphins sightings and maybe turtles too. It's enjoyable in the blue water, watching wildlife, and catch some fish.

Gear:

• Lighter weight harbor gear will work; 2,500 – 3,000 spinning reel with 20 – 40 lb braid with 20 lb leader.

Rigging:

- Use a 3 4-ounce weight with offset attachments and a swivel on at least one of the attachments. Tie the weight to the braid. Consider using a swivel clip to the braid to easily change out the weight.
- Figure out how much line one crank of your reel retrieves; make your 20 lb leader 2 -3 times that length. Tie your leader to the offset end of the weight.
- Jighead weight will vary based on current; 3/8 and ¾ ounce may be enough. Or use a hook with a banana weight.
- Use live or dead shrimp (pinch the tail off), white bait, or shrimp bits.

Technique:

- Drop on the side of the boat, hit the bottom, reel up 2 3 cranks, and drift.
- Adjust the number of cranks to determine what is working.
- The weight should be above the structure, with the weight of the jighead keeping the bait near/but off the structure.
- The snapper will be holding on the structure and will come off the structure for the food, but not too far off the structure to expose themselves to their predators.
