FISHING REPORT



NOVEMBER 2023

Autumn fishing is slowly approaching. To me it seems like we have summer and autumn fishing at the same time. The water temperatures are still fairly warm, the salinity increasing, and fall migration has begun.

Tripletail are being caught on near shore crab pots; most are not keepers, but a few are. They should also be showing up in the harbor around the channel markers and other structure. A live shrimp on a jighead or a Vudu Shrimp will work.

King Mackerel are migrating through and is a species not targeted by many club members. Why is that? It doesn't take an off-shore boat to target them. Most bay boats can easily target them as you don't need to go too far out; the range starts at 18' of water and goes to 150'. There hasn't been a King Mackerel submitted all year. If lack of knowledge is holding you back, please check out the King Mackerel section of the October 2023 fishing seminar on our website for information. Club member Gary Selzer provided in-depth information on gear, tackle, rigging, bait, and areas to look in the October seminar. The seminar can be found by going to:

King Mackerel is a Master Angler Tournament fish and a points fish for Ladder of Achievement.

Cobia are showing up in larger numbers around the harbor, off the bars, and around structure. Folks are seeing them hanging with the tarpon too. Cobia are eating larger shrimp on a jighead, larger gulp on a bucktail, ladyfish, and if you can catch a sugar trout, that is like crack for cobia.

The redfish bite continues to be strong. A few slot fish have been caught; most are over or under slot (which I am happy about). Some areas to try: creek mouths on the west wall on an outgoing tide, the shoals around turtle bay,

past Burnt Store by two pines, bushes by Bokeelia, structure near the many passes in our area, and Gasparilla Sound near Whidden Creek. Last time (a month ago) we were behind the bars on the east wall the water quality was awful with large clumps on decaying grass; hopefully the high winds pushed all that crap out. Using shrimp is always a good bait of choice, cut ladyfish will result in fewer bites and larger fish, artificial shrimp too; don't forget to rig a gold spoon as well and try a popping cork. Finding schools of mullet is a good indicator there may some schooling redfish nearby.

The snook bite has been great; not huge snook, but lots of them. Many guides are catching them in numbers near the first several houses as you come into Ponce from the harbor and several hundred feet into the Rim Canal (a few redfish have been caught too). The reports on the bait are varied from using live bait, dead small bait, and Rapala Countdown lures size 03 to 09. In the October seminar Richy Kale spoke to many tactics for targeting various size snook. He attributed the great snook bite in the canals to the amount of glass minnows hanging out in our back yard waters right now.



Fish of the Month For NOVEMBER

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

MANGROVE SNAPPER



Identification:

- Dark brown or gray in color, with red-orange spots in bars along the sides
- Two large canine teeth near front of upper jaw
- Anchor-shaped vomerine tooth patch
- Dorsal fins with dark or reddish borders
- Young have dark stripe from snout, through eye, to upper edge of gill cover

Locations/Behavior:

- Found near structure such as reefs, mangroves, docks, and seagrass.
- Bigger snapper found on off-shore/near-shore reefs and hard bottom
- Eat a variety of bait: shrimp, soft plastics, trolling lures, fish bites, white bait, etc. Larger mangrove snapper off-shore/near-shore take live bait, squid, shrimp (love cigar minnows).
- The bite is hard and fast. They are aggressive eaters and swimmers.
- Spawn June August

Technique

- Set the hook quick; otherwise, your bait will be stolen
- Cast at docks/pilling during medium and high tides. Be ready for them to bite while the bait is falling.
- During lower tides they often are a few feet from the dock or pilings.

Gear/rigging:

- In-shore light gear, smaller hook or jighead. 10-15 lb braid and 10 15 lb leader.
- Off-shore/Near-shore "grouper set up" or other heavier gear.
