It was Thursday July 4, 2024, Independence Day. Moon phase was Waning Gibbous. Since it was July, it was tarpon time. As I cleared the #6 pole exiting Ponce, I throttled down, skeeter jump, rum line to alligator reef. As I came off

plane I smiled, finally the tarpon were rolling, north side of the

reef. I had Mecca for a spell, lots of silvers [Tarpon] and no boats, no time for danglers, I picked up my St. Croix [rod] and ripped a cast across rolling tarpon, the line tightened, and silver went airborne, now that's fireworks! 4 for 7 isn't bad for a Jersey boy.



Offshore: This period of July & August bottom fishing was considered by our offshore guys as truly fantastic with the full moon spawn of mangroves many fish of 5 pounds and better went on ice, and I saw a pic of one that went over 9 pounds. If you knew where to find the yellow tail you did equally as good. A buddy of mine did well on wahoo and black tuna, high speed trolling. He will be



speaking at our September meeting; come listen & learn. My 2 permit trips to the inshore reefs were well worth the time it took to scoop up a bunch of pass crabs hill tides work best for me [strong outgoing tides] when the crabs are flushing.

Inshore: the hot summer days find the inshore fish feeding more at night or the low light hours. The 2-hour evening trips around the canal mouths from Colony point to Fishville always produces well with snook, jacks, trout, reds and juvenile tarpon. It's a great way to spend an evening. Hint, hint soon it will change from minnows to crustaceans, keep watching for it. But for now, it's jerk bait time.


Sharks: shark fishing in the harbor this year was a pleasant surprise with the large number and larger than average size, rods bent often, cut bait or lady fish is all that's needed. There were so many and still are sharks this year that it is the first time I heard of more than one tarpon getting eaten in our harbor. Very unusual but it does happen now and then for the silver king, if I said it's a weird year that would be an understatement. 500 fish biting for 3 days then gone for 4 days. It's the

most I have ever seen tarpon move around in the harbor, hide and seek every day. But that anticipation and pull keeps the game alive.

So please, please, please go out and give our beautiful fish -filled harbor a try. So now it is time



for me to say so long until next month. It's time for my evening walk alone, for the semi sad eyes of my yellow closed for the last time on July 2, 2024. I hope and pray that all that read this article, have a chance, if for only 1 day, to have a yellow at their side as true as my Brandy and Sunshine were.





Fish of the Month For SEPTEMBER

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

BLACK DRUM



Identification:

- Smaller black drum can be confused with sheepshead due to the whiteish coloring with black stripes. You won't be targeting the small ones this month!
- As they get larger, they lose their striping and become golden in color.
- · Wide bodies, tails, and head.
- Can hear the "drum" sound.

Location/finding them:

- During summer months they school up in the canals, schools can have 10 to hundreds of fish.
- They can be in the port charlotte canals and canals by Bass Inlet; near larger open bodies of water.
- If you have good side scan and know how to use side scan; you can't miss them.
- Look for little baitfish and disturbances on the surface as well as the bottom getting mucked up.

Gear/tackle:

- Light gear works well: an 8 14 rod with a 3,000 spinning reel. You'll be casting a lot and making long casts.
- Soft plastics with a small strong hook (eighth ounce jig head with gulp), crab, and shrimp all
 work. Stay away from using larger hooks as it increases foul hooking the fish; putting undue
 stress/harm on the fish.
- 20-pound 3' leader and fluorocarbon.

BLACK DRUM, Continued

Technique:

- They like a slow presentation. So slow that you should feel your lure over the school or on the bottom. I mean slow.......
- The bite is subtle, your line will start to straighten, then the fish will realize it's hooked and make a run for it. They'll run a few times, again when they see the boat, and again when they see the net.
- With the high-water temperatures, it's important to revive the fish. There are plenty of good video's out there on how to do that.

Miscellaneous:

- Running through a school with your engine will cause them to scatter; you'll piss off other boats.
 Use your trolling motor, if you don't have a trolling motor stay on the outside of the school.
- Black drum is a species for Ladder of Achievement and eligible for points.
- This is an easy, fun, and big fish to catch. Hardest part is finding the schools.

Interesting Tidbits

With the height of absentee members cooling themselves in the north or on vacation and the abundance of continual rain this month, there were very few anglers reporting catches. Our FOM, Tarpon, had a reporting of only 4 catches – one 300 pointer by veteran tarpon angler Rick Sarkisian, and a few one pointers by lady anglers Elaine Bretts and Donna Sullivan. According to our rules: Tarpon and shark awards will be based on the total number of points accumulated for these species caught in their respective award months: 1st place for the most points, 2nd place for the second most points and 3rd place for the third most points. Any tarpon or shark estimated to be 5 feet or longer to the fork is awarded 3 points, whereas any smaller fish will only be awarded 1 point. While the report of redfish recovery in the Harbor has been pessimistic, Tim Lock, along with fishing buddies Bill Muir and Dave Joe cleaned up on redfish catching a total of 29 reds from 17-27". Glenn Ranfos also reported a 21" red, so keep looking for those spot tailed bruisers – they are out there! The FOM for September is Black Drum and several have already been reported in the canals in the last 2 months. They are a lot of fun and will readily take DOA Baitbuster type offerings. Use side scanning sonar in the canals to find the schools and then have fun catching and releasing them till they wear you out! Alternatively, a half blue crab soaked off your dock may do the trick without ever launching the boat. These spawning fish are far too large to be very edible, so release them quickly in this warm season so they can continue their drumbeat down the Harbor. There are some species you can target offshore: for the first half of this month, gag grouper are open. There are also yellowtail and mangrove snappers out there that will respond well to chum. Checkout the club fFacebook photo posts from August 11.



Membership Report For AUGUST

At the end of August the club enjoyed having 307 members from 160 households. Our membership numbers usually reflect about 10% of the PGICA overall membership. The PGICA's overall membership is also down about 10% from the previous year, which also reflects in our numbers being down from previous years.
