FISHING REPORT For APRIL

Offshore:

Anglers have made their way out to the 100 foot plus depth for some Red Grouper action. Although the action has slowed a bit, multiple fish were returned to the dock for most trips. Red grouper, Vermillion Snapper and Lane Snapper were the most encountered species. Some Mangrove Snapper also have been reported. Fish were tricked on dead baits, live baits and jigs. Remember to have a descending plan for those fish that don't meet the minimum Red Grouper 20 inch size limit for harvest. The best method is to actually descend the fish using one of the descending devices. By law, you must have this equipment on board and use it. Also note that grouper are not the only fish that require descending, Lane Snapper caught at depth will also experience barotrauma. This trauma can be minimized by reeling fish in slowly if you suspect the fish will be returned. African Pompano have also made for some good action.

Amberjack are providing some off-shore action. These fish are fun to catch and are really good fighters. You'll want to have the appropriate gear which may include a two-speed reel! AJs can be caught with a variety of methods but best using live bait and artificial lures. Slow pitch jigs, vertical jigs, top water plugs can all produce. Actually changing tactics while fishing for amberjacks will increase your chances of catching multiple fish. Make sure your knots are good and drag set appropriately!

Inshore:

Tarpon have arrived. After a slow start the Fish Club's Tarpon fleet have had some good reports. The pass remains active especially with the spring tides flushing crabs out. These fish should be available all summer so if you can stand the heat, go for it. The normal pattern is for the schools to move into the deeper holes during the warm weather.

Snook and Mangrove Snapper have been good lately in the canals and inlets. Multiple reports of nice size snapper caught on small live bait. A few flounder have also been caught in Turtle Bay. Flounder are best tricked during moving water, using a jig with either a strip of bait, shrimp or gulp.

Spanish Mackerel have been providing some good action in the mid harbor. Schools can many times be located with bird/bait activity. Trolling small spoons can make for some good catching. Fish up to twenty inches, fork measurement are not uncommon. Try casting for them when the fish are concentrated for some fun. Silly jigs, spoons and hard swim baits are favored; soft plastics will get torn up. Consider using a wire bite leader. Fishing near shore Gulf may produce larger fish with the possibility of some Kings and even Bonita. Using an in-line sinker or small planer board will allow for fishing different depths.

Jacks have been hit or miss, but there sure have been some big ones! I like tossing hard plastics or spoons into the schools when they show up. Have a rig set up and be ready for some pullage!

Fish of the Month For MAY

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

COBIA



Gear, Tackle, Bait and Rigging:

- Medium/heavier rod 12 – 25 with a 3,000 or 4,000 spinning reel is ideal if you hook into the big one. Can go lighter.
- 20-to-30-pound braid tied to 40-pound leader will get the job done.
- Jig head with a shrimp or large gulp works as well as a bucktail with a long gulp. Whitebait, crabs, and cut bait will get a bite.

Locations:

- Channel markers, reefs in the harbor, structure in the harbor, as well as drop offs from sand bars are some of their cruising areas.
- They are known to follow schools of rays and be mixed in with schools of tarpon. If you see a school of rays go by, be ready to throw something this time of year.

Additional Information:

- Minimum length 36" to the fork in state and federal waters.
- Daily bag limit: 1 per person per day or 2 per boat; whichever is less.
- They hit hard and immediately make a run, run again, and again. Get away from any structure and let them run; wear them out before bringing them to the boat. Likely another cobia or two will follow the cobia up. Bringing a green cobia into the boat can cause damage to the boat and people. Wear the fish out in the water and get it in the ice box immediately.

Interesting Tidbits

Snook, our Fish of the Month for April, did not disappoint with 6 reported catches up to a 28". Four of the six snook turned in where from our Lady anglers – way to go, Ladies! The ever-present sea-trout amassed a total of 15 catches reported up to a “gator sized 25” fish caught by Mike White and a 24” fish by Donna Sullivan. Those able to get offshore when the April winds briefly calmed found 5 reported Red Grouper up to a respectable 30” beauty wrangled by Rick Brown. Large American Red Snapper, AJs and African Pompanos and gags were also released well offshore (see photos on our facebook page). Inshore the Spanish Mackerel continued to show their toothy grin amassing 7 catches. Sharks both in shallow and deep waters were reported with 4 different species of sharks being caught. Tarpon time is now upon us, and we had 3 reported catches this month. Joe Esposito earned both his Bronze and Silver Pins in the same month with some nice catches.

For those of you looking forward to chasing American Red Snapper, The Governor has announced the longest recreational season yet with 126 days beginning Memorial Day Weekend from May 24-26 and reopening June 1 through July 31. The fall season will include the following dates: Sept. 1-14; Sept. 19-21; Sept. 26-28; Oct. 3-5; Oct. 10-12; Oct. 17-19; Oct. 24-26; Oct. 31-Nov. 2; Nov. 7-9 & 11 (Veterans Day); Nov. 14-16; Nov. 21-23; Nov. 27-30 (Thanksgiving weekend); Dec. 5-7; Dec. 12-14; Dec. 19-21; Dec. 25-28 (Christmas weekend)

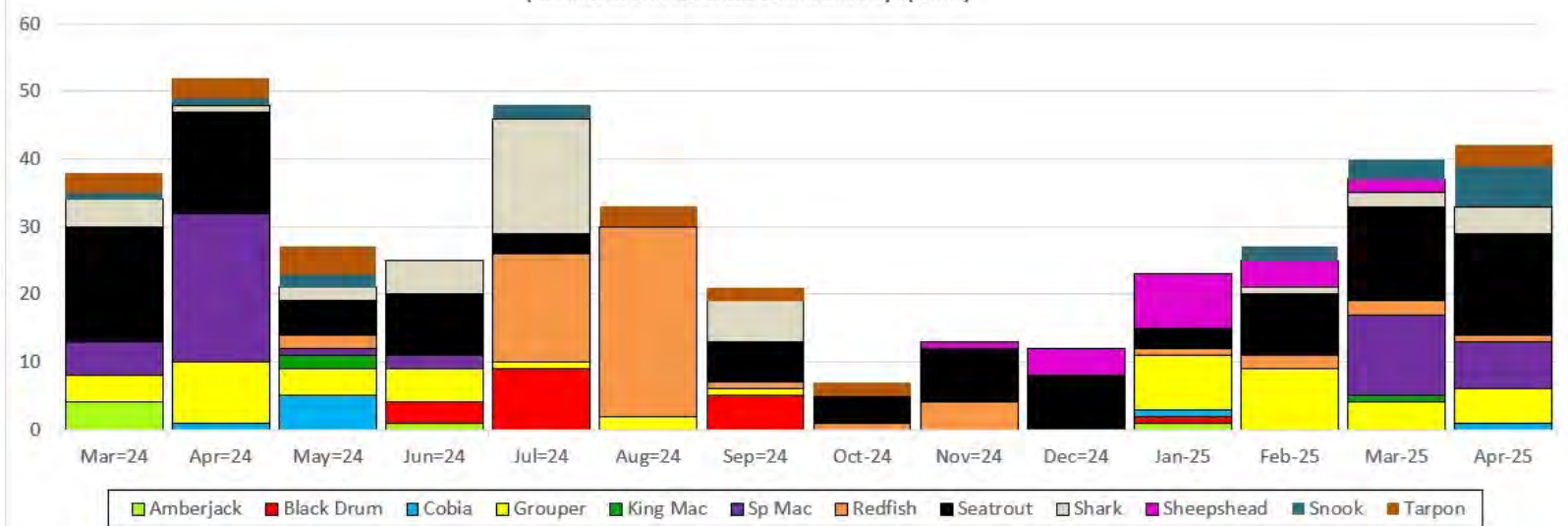

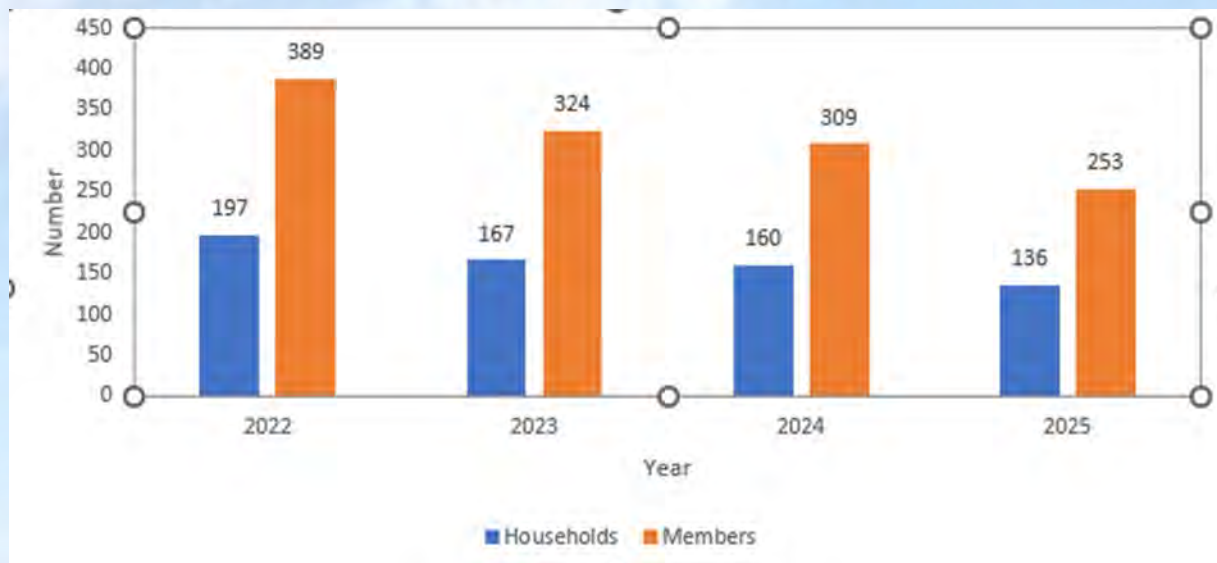

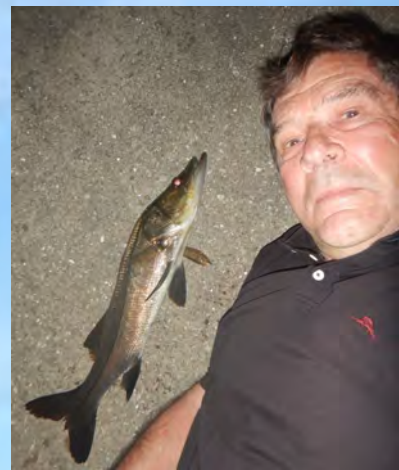
