FISHING REPORT For MAY

Offshore:

Offshore trips have resulted in mixed results recently. Rough seas have cancelled some plans and have shortened other trips. Those who were able to get out are reporting Red Grouper limits to 30 inches, while others are encountering less than desirable results. Let's face it; it is fishing. Most success was in over 100 foot depth. In addition to Red Grouper, Grey Snapper, Vermillion Snapper and Lane Snapper were the most encountered species. Some of the Greys were in the 20 inch range. To target the Mangrove Snapper consider using lighter leaders and smaller hooks. Fish were tricked on dead baits, live baits and jigs.

Remember to have a descending plan for those fish that don't meet the minimum Red Grouper 20 20-inch size limit for harvest. The best method is to actually descend the fish using one of the descending devices. By law, you must have this equipment on board and use it. Also note that grouper are not the only fish that require descending, Lane Snapper for instance, caught at depth will also experience barotrauma. This trauma can be minimized by reeling fish in slowly if you suspect the fish will be returned. The most common symptoms are bulging eyes, gas bubbles formed under the skin, bleeding gills or an expanded swim bladder that pushes the stomach out of the fish's mouth.

Inshore:

The canals are producing a mixed bag of Snook and Mangrove Snapper. In addition, juvenile Tarpon have made a strong showing. Most small Tarpon are being caught on live bait, but consider tossing a paddle tail and work it slowly.

Turtle Bay continues to produce good catches of trout. In addition to trout, some Permit have been caught in Turtle Bay using live bait or silly jigs. Familiarize yourself with the difference between a Florida Pompano and a Permit as fishing regulations differ. These fish can be confused for one another. Permit have a wider body and are silvery with a yellow patch in front of their anal fin. Permit have a deeper forked tail and the juveniles usually have an orange fin. Pompano can be

golden all over with a yellow underside. Pompano tails are wider and although forked are not as deep a vee as a Permit. Consult the FishRules app for a visual and to make sure you are not in violation of the current laws. Both fish make excellent table fare.

Spanish Mackerel have spread out, but some nice catches are still available. Schools can many times be located with bird/bait activity and/or by fishing structure. Trolling small spoons can make for some good catching. Fish up to twenty inches, fork measurement are not uncommon. Try casting for them when the fish are concentrated for some fun. Silly jigs, spoons and hard swim baits are favored; soft plastics will get torn up. Consider using a wire bite leader. Fishing near shore Gulf waters may produce larger fish with the possibility of some Kings and even Bonita. Using an in-line sinker or small planer board will allow for fishing different depths.

Jacks have been hit or miss, but there sure have been some big ones! I like tossing hard plastics or spoons into the schools when they show up. Have a rig set up and be ready for some pullage!



Fish of the Month For JUNE

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

JACK CREVALLE



Gear, Tackle, Rigging, and Technique:

- Medium to light rod with a 3,000 spinning reel or whatever you have will work.
- 20-pound braid tied to 20-pound leader will get the job done. Jacks don't seem to be line-shy when they are feeding. If fishing around a lot of structure you may want to go heavier.
- X-rap, spoons, Wild Eyed Storm Shads, and most other lures work when they are feeding. Always crimp the bards when using tremble hooks, or replace treble hooks with a single hook.
- A lure with some weight will increase casting distance and increase chances of a hook up. Try Storm Shads; they are heavy and have a single hook.
- Look for "boiling water"; that signifies something is feeding on bait pods. Cast through the bait pod and **retrieve fast**. They are very aggressive when feeding.
- Trolling can also be productive.

Summer Locations:

- Look for schools of mullet, other baitfish, and birds diving.
- Troll off the sandbars and near the beaches this time of year.
- Can be found off shore, but not common.

Additional Information:

- Fork length measurement.
- Black spot on their gill and pectoral fin.
- They put up a good fight for their size.
- Not very good eating; but some people do eat them.
- Make excellent shark bait. Keep it alive and use a sinker on a shark set up outside Turtle Bay or "the hill"; you'll get great results!

Interesting Tidbits

While our fish of the month (Cobia) only garnered 2 reports, many other species were tallied this month including 15 grouper submissions (mostly reds) up to an impressive 34" red grouper caught by Kevin Huey. Seatrout, our go to fish nearly every month, had 23 submissions up to a nice 23 incher by Mike White. Tarpon were available with six reports including Rick Sarkisian's four 300 pointers and Beth Watkins' 40 incher she wrangled on a flyrod – very impressive! Spanish Mackerel were still around with three reports up to a nice 25 incher caught by Donna Sullivan. Sharks are beginning to be a regular part of our report for May as the water has warmed a bit early with four toothy beasts tallied.


The Board added four more species to the LOA list on May 13, including Mangrove Snapper, Red Snapper, African Pompano, and Spadefish. With the opening of the Red Snapper season (see below) we already had 3 reported catches up to a monster 35" beast caught by Mike White and a 15" Spadefish caught by Fred De Mella. The Snapper (all) species previously on the LOA species list has now become Snapper (all others excluding Mangrove and Red Snapper and Yellowtail snapper) which are considered separate species on the newly revised LOA species list. If you turned in a mangrove snapper as a new species prior to May 13, we have moved that species credit to the newly created Mangrove Snapper species which opens up the new "Snapper all others" so you can now turn in such commonly caught snappers as Lanes, etc.

Congratulations to Bill Muir who became the Club's 47th Grand Master Angler and to Bobby Bretts who earned his 10th GMA Star along with Mike White who earned his 7th GMA Star.

For those of you looking forward to chasing American Red Snapper, the Governor has announced the longest recreational season yet with 126 days beginning Memorial Day Weekend from May 24-26 and reopening June 1 through July 31. The fall season will include the following dates: Sept. 1-14; Sept. 19-21; Sept. 26-28; Oct. 3-5; Oct. 10-12; Oct. 17-19; Oct. 24-26; Oct. 31-Nov. 2; Nov. 7-9 & 11(Veterans Day); Nov. 14-16; Nov. 21-23; Nov. 27-30 (Thanksgiving weekend); Dec. 5-7; Dec. 12-14; Dec. 19-21; Dec. 25-28 (Christmas weekend)

Speaker: Mike White - Techniques for catching Cobia

- May FOM is Cobia– open season 36" minimum size to keep.
 - a. They are kind of like a cat fish because they feed on the bottom. They often are found following manatees or rays because they push up bait from the bottom.
 - b. Often found around markers, structures or wrecks.
 - c. Use 40 60# braid and 30 40# leader and bright colors like yellow and pink. You can use fresh bait (shrimp and pinfish), lures with scent (flair hawk jig, white twister tails) and cut bait.
 - d. They often hit bait that is falling and are active at slack tides.
 - e. You can also troll for Cobia at a speed of 1.2 to 1.5 mph. (use, rebels and wide wobble lures)
 - f. Make sure the hooks you are using are very sharp.
 - g. You can use an FG knot or a modified albright knot.






