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FISHING REPORT

AUGUST 2026

Offshore:

Recent offshore trips have been successful with reports of Red Grouper and assorted Snapper. Red Grouper are available if you are willing to make the long run to 120+ depth. Most fish caught on cut bait/squid. The snapper bite has been variable with reports from fair to good. Many are reporting smaller fish, although some nice Yellowtail have come in. Important also to remember that the length of Lane Snapper is now 10" minimum and 20 fish limit. Large sharks are getting their share of the Grouper and Yellow Tail catches.

Always remember to have a descending plan for those fish that don't meet the minimum size limit for harvest. The best method is to actually descend the fish using one of the descending devices. By law, you must have this equipment on board and use it. Also note that Grouper are not the only fish that require descending, Red and Lane Snapper caught at depth will also experience barotrauma.

Inshore:

It's Tarpon Time in Charlotte Harbor! The fish have spread out and can be found in the usual spots around Charlotte Harbor, the deeper holes and wrecks. Most fish are being caught on live bait, with ladyfish being the favorite bait, but other live bait is also working. Try live ladyfish on the inshore structure. Bait buster lures are the go to artificial.

The trout bite has been consistent. Reports of multiple keepers and even points fish on recent trips. Most are being caught on live shrimp, but rubber lures are also effective. The key here is finding good grass and suitable habitat. This is requiring longer runs through the lower harbor/ICW. Interestingly, some catches are being reported in slightly deeper water, likely due to the warm water temperatures.

Florida Pompano have been showing up in the mix for inshore anglers. These fish are fun to catch and very good at the dinner table. They will take live shrimp, but are caught easily on jigs, with or without bait or lures. Try banana jigs (marketed under various names). These fish can be located by watching for top water activity, especially in the boat wake. Remember these are a fork measurement, with 11 inches being the minimum size.

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FISHING REPORT

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Sharks are still being reported and are responsible for many points this past month; some are pretty big measuring over six foot in length. Catches of Blacktip, Bonnethead, Bull, Hammerhead and Sharpnose are fairly common in Charlotte Harbor. Expect to also find spinner sharks this time of year. Fish were mostly caught on live ladyfish or cut bait. Chumming is not necessary, but might make for more action.

The Snook bite has slowed a bit with the warm canal water temperature. They can still be taken in the canals or at the bridges mostly at low light conditions. Make sure you take care to release these fish quickly to prevent inadvertent kills. Be ready for a quick photo. Live white bait is a no brainer here. They can also be fooled with swim baits. Slow down your presentation since oxygen levels are a bit low due to warm water conditions and fish may be a bit sluggish. Both Snook and Redfish can be targeted under mangroves during the warmer months.

Black Drum are showing up in canals and just in time for they are Fish of the Month for September! These big fish can be caught on bait of course; clams, crabs and even cut bait will entice them. These fish are very sensitive to smell and chum can be effective. They also can be caught on artificials; paddletails and jig heads can be very productive once schools are located. Be sure to support the weight of these big fish to prevent internal organ damage before release. Do NOT hold up by the gill plate or lips! These fish can actually live as long as our most senior Grand Master Anglers!

Whiting are also available for those who need to log that species. Many are being caught in the 6 or 7 foot depth near the bars. Mangrove Point is also a good spot to try. Most are caught on jigs. These fish are very good table fare.

Fish of the Month For SEPTEMBER

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

BLACK DRUM



Identification:

- Smaller black drum can be confused with sheepshead due to the whiteish coloring with black stripes. You won't be targeting the small ones this month!
- As they get larger, they lose their striping and become golden in color.
- Wide bodies, tails, and head.
- Can hear the "drum" sound.

Location/finding them:

- During summer months they school up in the canals, schools can have 10 to hundreds of fish.
- Pre hurricane Idalia they were in the port charlotte canals and canals by Bass Inlet; near larger open bodies of water.
- If you have good side scan and know how to use side scan; you can't miss them.
- Look for little baitfish and disturbances on the surface as well as the bottom getting mucked up.

Gear/tackle:

- Light gear works well: an 8 – 14 rod with a 3,000 spinning reel. You'll be casting a lot and making long casts.
- Soft plastics with a small strong hook (eighth ounce jig head with gulp), crab, and shrimp all work. Stay away from using larger hooks as it increases foul hooking the fish; putting undue stress/harm on the fish.
- 20-pound 3' leader and fluorocarbon.

Location, Description, Tips, Tackle and Bait

BLACK DRUM, continued

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Technique:

- They like a slow presentation. So slow that you should feel your lure over the school or on the bottom. I mean slow.....
- The bite is subtle, your line will start to straighten, then the fish will realize it's hooked and make a run for it. They'll run a few times, again when they see the boat, and again when they see the net.
- With the high-water temperatures, it's important to revive the fish. There are plenty of good video's out there on how to do that.

Miscellaneous:

- Running through a school with your engine will cause them to scatter; you'll piss off other boats. Use your trolling motor, if you don't have a trolling motor stay on the outside of the school.
- Black drum is a species for Ladder of Achievement and eligible for points.
- Master Angler Tournament currently has a 3-way tie for first place at 42".
- This is an easy, fun, and big fish to catch. Hardest part is finding the schools

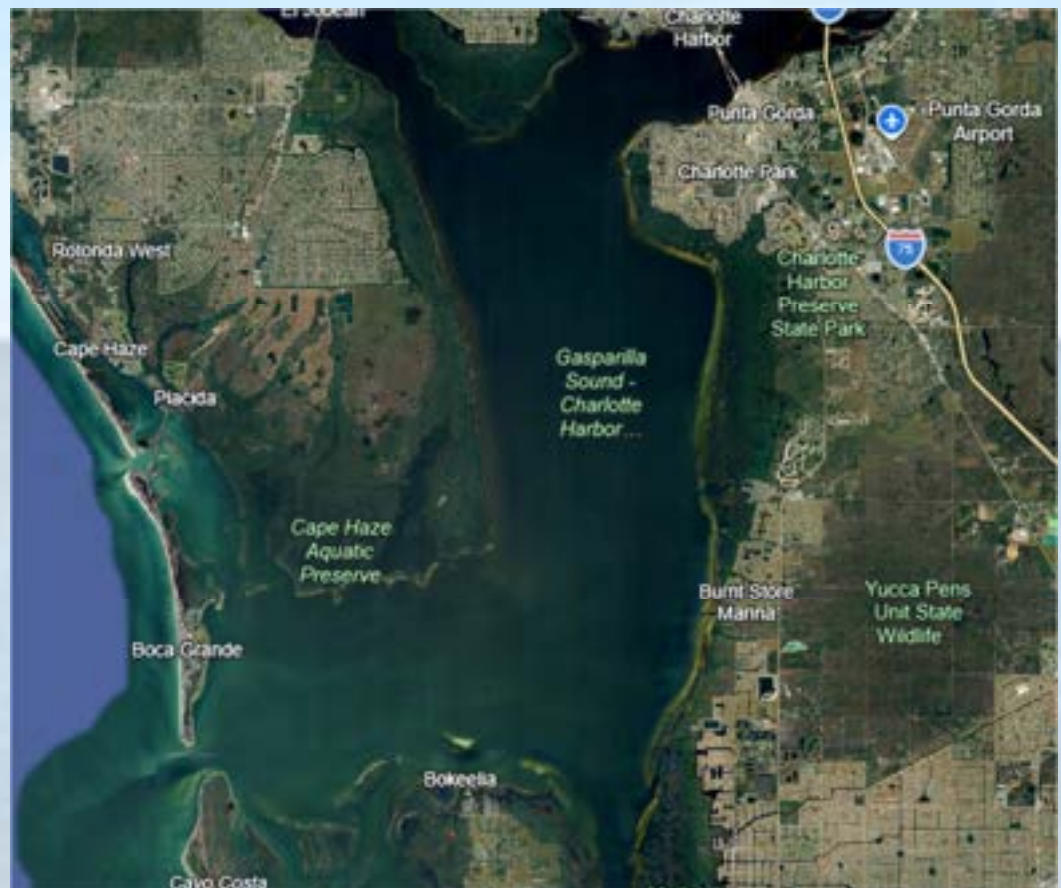
Hello Fishing Gurus

Heat, humidity, multiple thunderstorms, and vacations all combined to limit our catches this month. Those who found one of the few better weather days to get offshore still managed some nice red grouper, but wise fishermen know those long runs back to shore in the afternoons are risky for those thunderboomers coming out to meet them. In-shore, the tarpon were available but only two anglers managed to find them as our Fish of the Month species. Donna Sullivan recorded two six footers on the same day – and that’s a lot of fighting in this August heat. Rick Sarkisian still found his favorite silver kings as a seasoned tarpon pro and secured his TENTH GMA star – congratulations! Singles of redfish, cobia, Spanish mackerel, snook, and black drum along with the ever-present summer sharks and dependable seatrout rounded out our catches for the month. Speaking of black drum – they are still in the canals and can be easily targeted in those safe waters in September as our Fish of the Month. Be sure to revive them and release them as soon as possible given the high water temperatures. Betsy Gregory joined her husband Jim for some fun fishing and earned her Club Hat catching four species on the same day – Way to go!

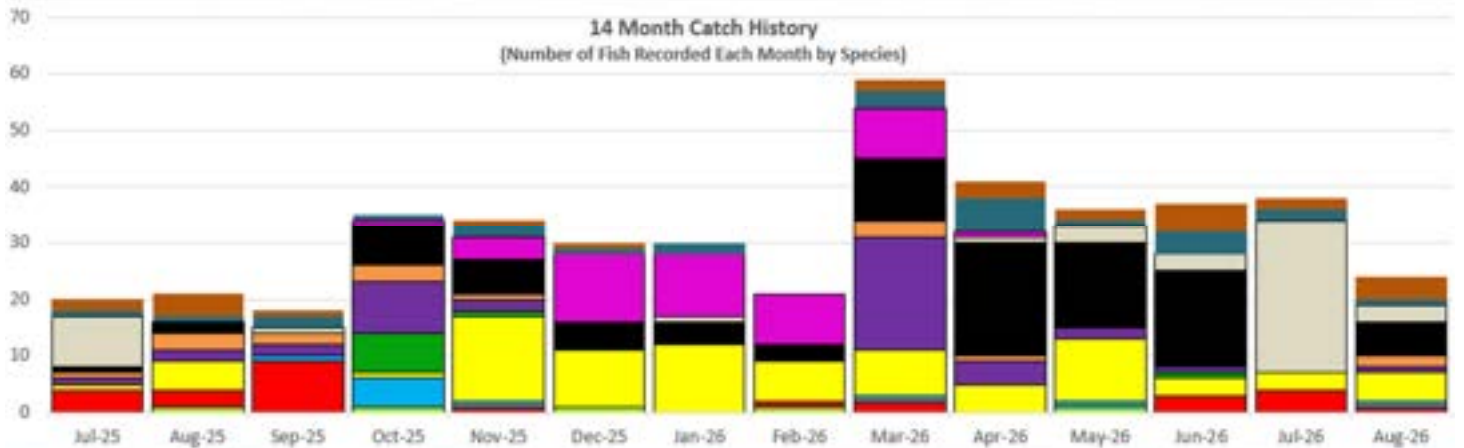

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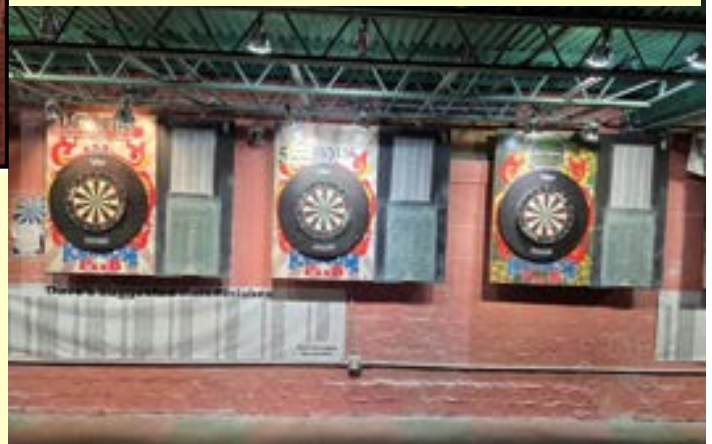
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
